Blessings upon you this Holy Week. May you and your loved ones be greatly blessed in the celebration of the Paschal Triduum, the Three days of Christian Passover. Three days of going to church and worship might seem like a lot. But it is worth your effort. Please be open and give the Triduum a chance. Think of the family occasions you gave up time and convenience to be there with the family: a Wedding, a Baptism, a Graduation, a Family Reunion, Special Birthdays, Anniversary Celebrations, and a family or close friend's funeral. It is making time for what might be a demand upon you that really makes the greatest gifts to treasure for years to come.

The great gift that God gives us is Divine Life in the Paschal Mystery, the on-going mystery of the Lord's dying and rising until the end of time. It begins Holy Thursday evening, the Solemnity of the Lord's Supper, continues into Friday with the Solemnity of the Lord's Passion and is completed at the Easter Vigil, Saturday night Mass. For those who are unable to attend the Saturday Easter Vigil Mass there will be Easter Morning masses at 0800 and 1100. Details and times are listed. Please note that next Saturday there is no 4:00 PM Saturday Mass, the Mass will be at 8:00 PM and worth celebrating. Please come!

I am getting old, and I feel the strain, but I wouldn't miss celebrating the Triduum. It is worth it; it is what keeps me going.

All are welcome to join Bishop Senior for the Diocesan Chrism Mass. During this Mass, Bishop Senior will bless the oils and consecrate the Sacred Chrism that will be used this year in the celebration of the sacraments.

A LITTLE CHURCH HISTORY

The parish school opened September 6, 1956 with registration of 80 pupils in the first five grades, representing all but six of the children in the parish eligible for those grades. The School Lunch Program, under the supervision of Mrs. Earl Swisher, was made available to the children the following day. "Lizzie" pictured below.



St. Joseph's Parish embraced a large territory. It included the towns of Milton, West Milton, New Columbia, Allenwood, Dewart, Watsontown, Pottsgrove and the rural section about these towns. Many of the children

needed transportation and a new 30 passenger school bus was delivered October 1, 1955 at a cost of \$3,790.

The expansion program and improvements of all parish building together with needed furnishings during the first five years that Father Topper was pastor necessitated an expenditure of \$150,238. The debt in April 1956 was \$60,000 with \$6,000 yet to be added to it before all work was accepted or completed. This was quite an accomplishment for a parish that had an ordinary income of less than \$10,000 and never could have been done without a loyal, devoted and pious people. Their labor of love was manifest in but one of the many projects they sponsored, the Parish Festival with net proceeds in 1955 of \$4,487.31. *Parish Festival stories to follow!*
