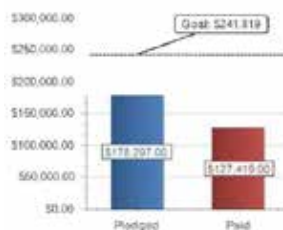

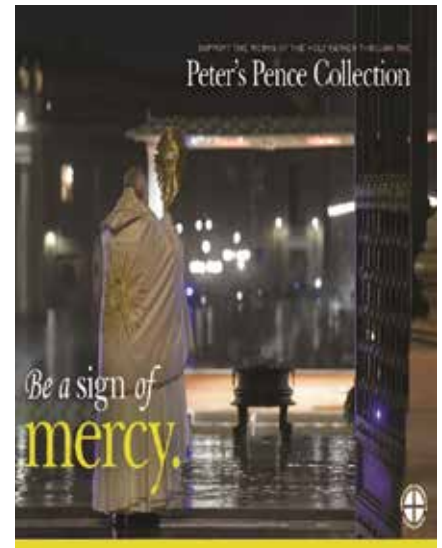

CREED 2021-2022

- CREED stands for Church of the Resurrection Elementary Education Days. It is our weekly religious education program for children in Pre-K through grade 5. The focus of the CREED program is to assist parents in their role as the primary religious educators of their children by providing religious education and formation classes for children of the parish who attend area public schools.
- There are 5 different sessions of CREED - 3 afternoons (Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday from 4:30-5:45) and 2 evenings (Monday and Tuesday from 6:15-7:30) each week.
- First Eucharist preparation is given to all 2nd graders during CREED. In order for a child to receive this sacrament, they must be baptized and have had one year of religious education prior to second grade. They must also be attending Mass on a weekly basis.
- There will be separate supplemental classes for children in grades 3-5 that have not yet received their First Eucharist. CIC (Christian Initiation of Children) will be held on Wednesday evenings beginning in January; your child must also be registered in a grade-appropriate CREED class.
- Registration for CREED will begin in mid-July.

PASS ON THE GOOD NEWS! What good news? The Good News of Jesus Christ and our Catholic faith! This fall, over 350 children, preschool through grade 5, will sign up to learn more about Jesus and the Catholic faith. You can help them learn and grow in faith by becoming a catechist for our CREED program. With classes offered Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday afternoons and Monday and Tuesday evenings, you are almost sure to find a time that fits your schedule. As you nurture the faith of our young, you will learn and grow as well! As one long-time catechist put it, "I learn so much from the children!" We provide you with training, lesson plans, supplies, and ongoing support. Classes will begin in late-September. 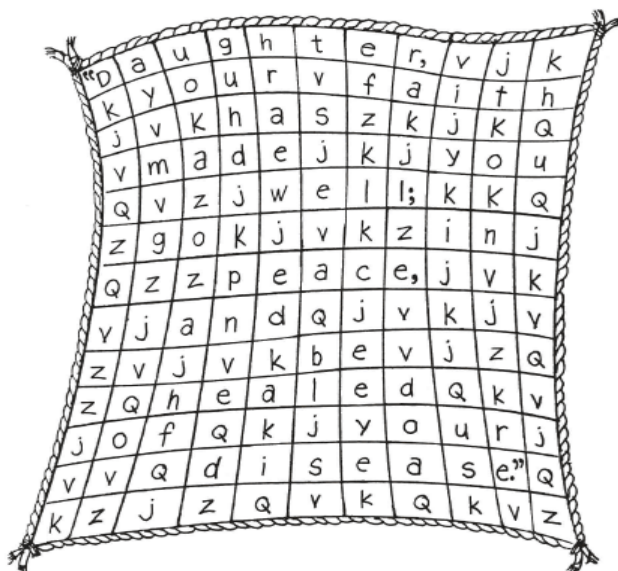

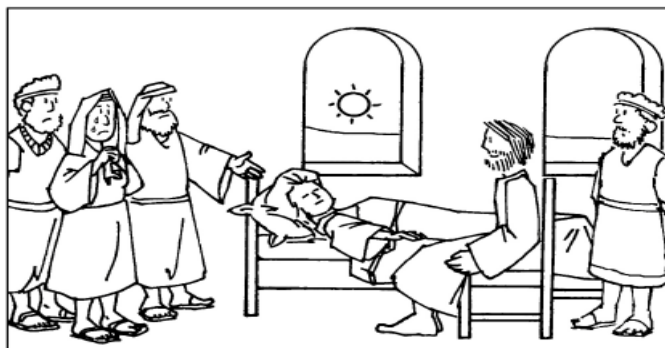

Below is an example of the vestments, they are a St. Philip style and include chasubles and matching dalmatics. This includes a total of 4 sets of vestments.

Once he is back in the US, plans will be made for a celebratory weekend here at Resurrection.





Disciple Maker Index Results

.....

Thank you to the more than 21,000 Catholics from all parts of the Diocese of Columbus who completed the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) Survey during Lent. The results are in, and the Diocese wanted to share some of the highlights.

The DMI is a 75-question survey designed to provide an opportunity for parishioners to reflect on their individual spiritual growth and overall parish effectiveness. Almost 300,000 Catholics at more than 1,500 parishes throughout 40 dioceses have taken the DMI since 2013, providing not just valuable data for each parish, but for the Church nationally, as well. Now the Diocese of Columbus can be counted among these national benchmark dioceses.



Reviewing the Results

Phase I (May - June)

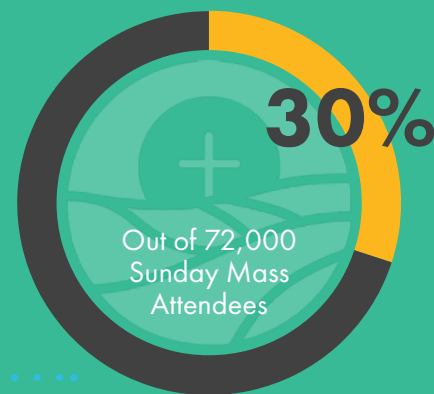
The DMI parish-specific results were sent to each parish to be reviewed by the pastor and his RPRF parish representatives, all of whom attended an information webinar in May to learn how to read and interpret the DMI data for their parish. They met to review the outcomes together and to draw meaningful conclusions from the data. The information generated from the DMI survey is quite extensive and required time, patience, and focus to understand it in its proper context. Thank you to pastors and RPRF representatives for your generosity in serving your parish in this way. Diocesan-wide results that reflect the collective responses from the more than 21,000 respondents are included here.

Phase II (late June - July)

Parishes will share their parish-specific results of the DMI with parishioners, along with information about the context of the survey and some initial conclusions reached by the pastor and his RPRF representatives.

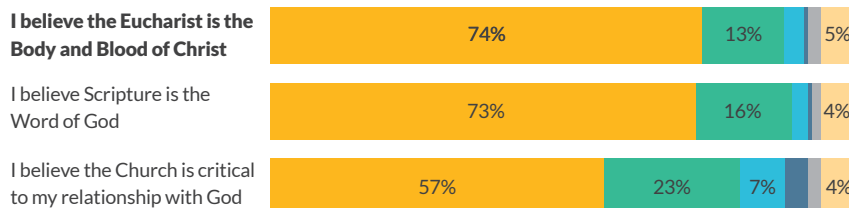

Over a five-year period, the Diocese of Columbus has averaged 72,000 Catholics attending Mass on a weekend. **Almost 30% of the individuals** completed the Disciple Maker Index this Lent. This is above the national average for other dioceses who have taken the DMI nationwide.

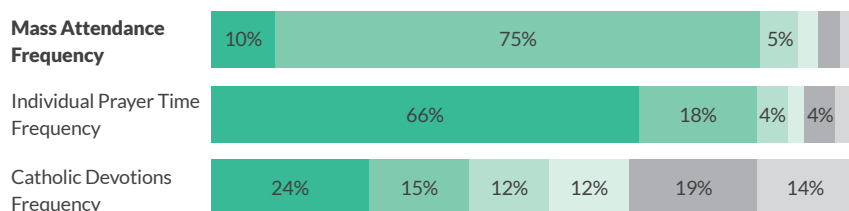
► Among the belief questions, survey respondents indicated the strongest belief in the following areas:

► With respect to faith practices, survey respondents indicated they most frequently engaged in the following activities:



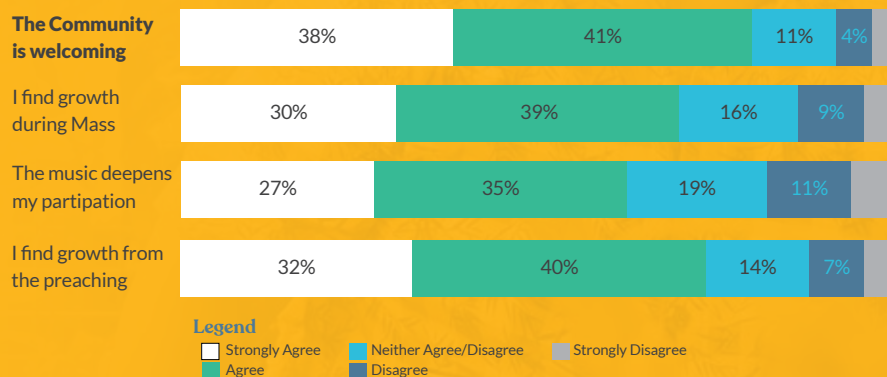

► How I personally view the Sunday Mass



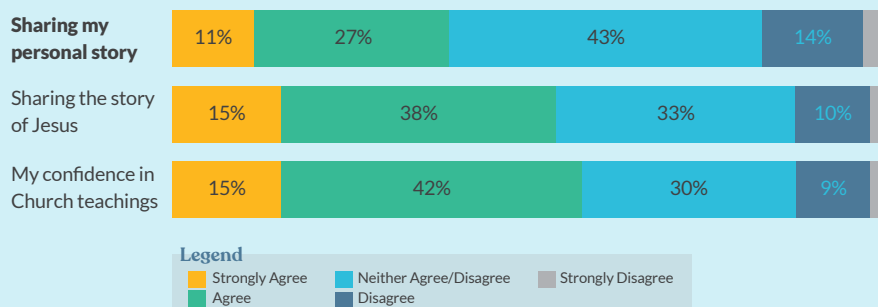
Fostering Spiritual Growth

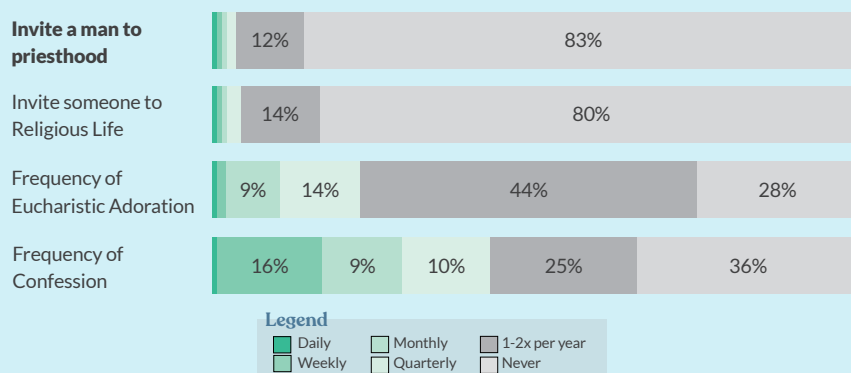

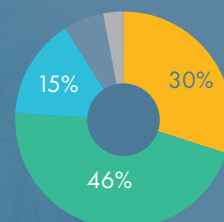
► With respect to the areas in which survey respondents felt they needed the most support from their parishes, the most significant were:



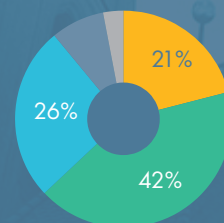
► With respect to the faith practices that survey respondents indicated they were doing the least, the most significant were:



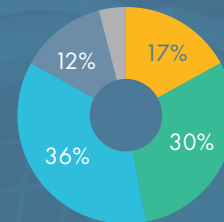

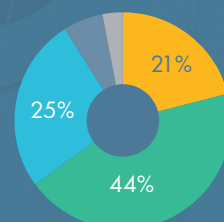
The Parish helps me grow my **prayer life**

Opportunities for Growth

As disciples, we have both the responsibility to come and to go. Not unlike the rest of the country, some of the biggest areas of growth for the Diocese of Columbus are based in our confidence in sharing the good news and inviting others whom we love into a deeper relationship with the Lord.

Especially as the *Real Presence, Real Future* initiative examines how best to serve our diverse diocese with fewer priests, our need to invite young men to consider the priesthood grows every year. Recently, many more women and men religious have accepted the invitation to serve our diocese. Through their presence, it is hoped that many more young women and men will be invited to consider religious life. As important as our priests, deacons, and religious are, the work of evangelization is not on their shoulders alone.

Similar to the rest of the country, the faithful in Columbus are looking to grow in confidence in sharing the richness of what the Church has to offer as well as our own personal stories of faith. The strategies and resources being researched and implemented as part of *Real Presence, Real Future* will seek to support parishes to equip their people for this important work.

5 Questions You Might Have

1. How will this, or can this, information be used by the parish or the diocese?

With any journey, you have to know your destination as well as where you are starting from in order to get there. While our journey as disciples and a Church is lifelong, the *Real Presence, Real Future* initiative wants to assist the entire Diocese of Columbus to take the next giant step toward our Lord. The Disciple Maker Index provides one snapshot of a large portion of our worshipping population. You are essential to the work of evangelization, in order to reach those who have not been practicing their faith. At a diocesan level, this information will help guide some of the research and resourcing that Bishop Brennan hopes to offer parishes and parish leaders in the future. At the parish level, it is the hope that by growing in understanding of where we are starting from, each community can help provide input and direction as to where we need to go. It is also a hope that several years from now, we can retake this index for another snapshot and see the progress we make together.

2. Who didn't we hear from?

The Disciple Maker Index intentionally focuses on those "in the pews." It gives a parish a sense of where their worshipping parishioners are in order to be able to discern strategies to build up this core group of Catholics and send them out on mission.

Of the 17,909 individuals who indicated their age, almost 10% indicated that they were age 35 or younger. While this is two points higher than Catholic Leadership Institute's national database of over 300,000, reaching out to our young adults will be an essential area of growth for all parishes in the next decade.

Of the 17,856 individuals who indicated their ethnicity, 11% were non-Caucasian with half of those individuals (5%) indicating a Latino/Hispanic. According to projected Census information, about 3% of the total population in the counties that comprise the Diocese of Columbus are Latino. However,

we know this is a growing segment of the Catholic population in Central Ohio.

3. What effect does COVID-19 have on these perceptions?

Catholic Leadership Institute has been administering the Disciple Maker Index since 2014. Interestingly, parishioner perceptions in the aggregate were not dramatically different pre-pandemic and during the pandemic. Further qualitative research shows that parishioners have been extremely grateful for the efforts their parishes have made during these difficult times in many cases boosting positive feedback if anything. Of course, time and the fruit of our current and future outreach efforts will tell us what the long-term effects might be from the pandemic.

4. What if my parish's results are better or worse than these diocesan averages?




This feedback is one lens through which we can grow in understanding of where we are as a Catholic community. There are many lenses through which to look. As was previously mentioned, the Disciple Maker Index gave us a snapshot of our starting place in 2021. While the diocesan results are a helpful benchmark, the most important thing is where we go next in service to God's people.

5. Where do we go from here?

The conversation continues. Key parish leaders from every parish have been reviewing this information and have been asked to share parish-specific thoughts over the summer. This Fall, there will be extensive consultation with all parishioners around strategies and models for the future based on this feedback as well as sacramental, financial, and socio-economic trends throughout the diocese. Thoughts on the Journey

June 27, 2021 - Mk 5:21-43

There is a small plaque that hangs on my kitchen wall that reads: **WHEN LIFE GIVES YOU MORE THAN YOU CAN STAND, KNEEL!** It's a nice little reminder that regardless of how much life hands you, take it to the Lord who knows all things, sees all things, and heals all things. I have to admit, that as good as it sounds on paper, it's hard to surrender the challenges and worries that plague us in our lifetime. The simple struggles are easy to release to God, but it's true that many of the things we grapple with are hard to bring to the light. Instead, we take them underground, especially things that have a stigma associated with them.

On the street where I grew up, was the Anderson family who lived several houses down from us. There was a mother, father, 3 boys, one daughter and a dog named Tippy. The boys were very athletic, the father worked very hard, the daughter was a typical little girl who was very shy and very sweet, but the mother was rarely seen outside of the house. One day while playing with other kids in the neighborhood, I saw the mother at the corner of our street shining the stop sign with a stuffed animal. She had on an apron and was talking to herself rather loudly. Within minutes, the father and two sons took her by the hands and escorted her home.

Not knowing what to think about what I witnessed, I went home and asked my mom what was wrong with Mrs. Anderson. She explained that she had several "nervous breakdowns" and that she didn't always think clearly. She followed it with a warning that *it's something we don't talk about*. I didn't understand what I saw and I didn't understand my mother's response.

In Mark's gospel this week, Jesus was once again being followed by crowds of people. Jairus, one of the rulers of the synagogue, approached Jesus in earnest and implored him to come quickly to heal his daughter who was at the point of death. Jesus agreed. As He made His way through the large crowd, a woman who had suffered with

hemorrhaging for years, touched His garment in the hopes of being healed. Jesus felt the power go out of Him, and stopped and asked who touched His clothes? The woman realizing she had been healed,

"... fell down before Jesus and told him the whole truth. He said to her, Daughter, your faith has saved you. Go in peace and be cured of your affliction."

Jesus then went to the home of Jairus to heal his dying daughter. There were two significant healings that day, both requiring faith in Jesus. One healing was for a person with status, the other was for a person who lived with the stigma of being ritually unclean, who had nothing, and who was alone in her suffering.

There is an increasing number of people who suffer from mental illness, addictions, anxieties, and other ailments that have a stigma connected to them. As a result, many of these people are fearful of others knowing and hide the reality of their suffering; they go underground. Like my neighbor, Mrs. Anderson, and the woman in the gospel, they are fearful that perhaps even Jesus would treat them as a social outcast? Not the case! The woman stood in front of Jesus, confessed everything to Him trusting that Jesus would heal her. Regardless of whether we're suffering in body, mind, or spirit, bringing the light of truth to Jesus is essential to healing. That's one of the benefits of the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

It is also crucial that we examine our attitudes and think differently about stigmatized suffering, especially with regards to mental illness. As imitators of Christ's compassion and mercy, we will help others heal when we ourselves remain open and understand that many of these challenges are chemical imbalances and are as real as any other illness. When they are ignored they lead to bigger problems. Like the woman in Mark's gospel, it takes courage to come forward and deal with the truth of who we are and what weighs down our bodies, minds, and hearts.

God is the champion of life

We're made for immortality. Christianity celebrates that death has no sting and life has no end. Our tenacious possession of the lives we're given is a sign of our refusal to accept death as the last word on the subject of our lives. We're impatient with limitations, reject gloom-and-doom projections, and insist on second opinions when the news is grim. We relentlessly cling to hope despite the odds of our predicament. God is on our side in this stubborn grip we have on life. God intends for death itself to pass away. Put your resources at the service of life.

TODAY'S READINGS: Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24; 2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43 (98). *"God did not make death, nor does [God] rejoice in the destruction of the living."*

MEMORIAL OF IRENAEUS, BISHOP, MARTYR

We're part of the Lord's great chain of being

It's fun to consider "six degrees of separation"—the theory that everyone on Earth is connected to any other person by a chain of five acquaintances. Perhaps you even know how you are connected to someone famous. Imagine being only three degrees separated from Jesus! Saint Irenaeus is known for that claim. He studied under Polycarp, who had been a disciple of the apostle John. We may be countless more degrees removed than Irenaeus, but all Christians are part of the chain that goes back to our Lord because we're the beneficiaries of what's been passed down the links along the way—as well as being links ourselves to the future. Keep those connections strong.

SOLEMNITY OF SAINTS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

Call me by my new name

Before Jesus, they were Simon and Saul; afterward, Peter and Paul. In the great biblical tradition, both experienced a name change to signify God's call to a new and greater destiny. They became the two pillars of the church. Jesus gave Peter the "keys" to unlock the "kingdom of God," on Earth as it is in heaven—the Kingdom Jesus preached about for three years. Paul received a "sword," the "sword of the Spirit" that's the word of God—which Paul used as he spread the gospel to new lands. Is there something new you can do for God today?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 12:1-11; 2 Timothy 4:6-8, 17-18; Matthew 16:13-19 (591). *"You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."*

You are part of God's agenda

Prayer has many forms and many expressions: It turns our hearts and minds to God with a desire to praise, to request, to give thanks, or to intercede on behalf of others. Prayer is conversation with God; sitting in silence with God; sharing with God every hope and fear we carry. But as Saint Thomas Aquinas reminds us, "We set forth our petitions before God, not in order to make known to Him our needs and desires, but rather so that we ourselves may

MEMORIAL OF JUNÍPERO SERRA, PRIEST, RELIGIOUS, MISSIONARY

Man on a mission

Today the church honors Saint Junípero Serra, the Spanish Franciscan missionary who tirelessly evangelized native peoples in California in the late 1700s, founding the first nine of 21 missions in the region. His sainthood is not without controversy since missionaries were enmeshed in the brutal Spanish conquest of the Americas, but Serra's record also shows he endured many hardships late in life for the sake of the gospel, genuinely loved the indigenous people, and defended their rights against the worst Spanish abuses. His memorial is a good time to learn about and pray for greater justice for Native Americans and all Indigenous Peoples.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 22:1b-19; Matthew 9:1-8 (380). *"He then said to the paralytic, 'Rise, pick up your stretcher, and go home.'"*

Friday, Jul 02, 2021

Pray for us sinners

Sometimes denial, shame, and fear keep us from recognizing the harmful effects of our sin. Pope Francis encourages us to give even our sin over to God. As he put it in a 2013 homily, "In my own life, I have so often seen God's merciful countenance, his patience; I have also seen so many people find the courage to enter the wounds of Jesus by saying to him: Lord, I am here, accept my poverty, hide my sin in your wounds, wash it away with your blood. And I have always seen that God did just this—he accepted them, consoled them, cleansed them, loved them." Draw close to Jesus and be comforted.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 23:1-4, 19; 24:1-8, 62-67; Matthew 9:9-13 (381). *"Go and learn the meaning of the words, 'I desire mercy, not sacrifice.' I did not come to call the righteous but sinners."*

FEAST OF THOMAS, APOSTLE

Let doubt deepen your faith

We have come to know today's saint as "Doubting Thomas," but in terms of his legacy, it was the missionary zeal that grew out of his doubt that endures. According to tradition, Thomas traveled far, reaching the Malabar Coast of southwest India, where he established a community still known today as "Saint Thomas Christians." A more diverse mix could not be found: the Nazranis, as they are called, are said to be "Indian in culture, Christian in faith, and Syrian in liturgy," with a dash of Jewish and Hindu influence for good measure. Your doubt can be the catalyst to a faith that endures and leaves a rich legacy. Ask God to help your unbelief!

**How Can Better Hearing Improve
