the typical form of any other Novena. Rather than 9 days of prayer, you repeat the short Novena prayer 15 times a day from November 30 through December 24.

St. Andrew Christmas Novena: Hail and blessed be the hour and moment in which the Son of God was born of the most pure Virgin Mary, at midnight, in Bethlehem, in the piercing cold. In that hour vouchsafe, I beseech Thee, O my God, to hear my prayer and grant my desires through the merits of Our Savior Jesus Christ, and of His blessed Mother. Amen.


Church of the Resurrection Women's Group





As we begin the *Season of Advent*, we are reminded to prepare for the second coming of Jesus Christ as we celebrate and commemorate His first coming, Christmas. We celebrate a *gift*: the birth of a Savior and King, God choosing to dwell among us and the *glorious return of the Son of Man* when the extravagant love of God will be poured out upon the cosmos and all humanity, transforming it into the new heaven and new earth.

Latin for the "coming" of Christ, Advent calls us to a deeper discernment of our lives and to "Watch and Prepare." An attitude of mindfulness increases our expectations as we open ourselves up to recognize the presence of Christ (the salvation of God) and to "be vigilant at all times...you do not know when the time (Lord) will come." We, His faithful disciples, consciously seek to identify Christ (Divine Guest) present within and among us. We prepare our lives for the One who dwells in our hearts and to be His Presence in the world as we are redeemed by God's holy love and advance toward Christ's definitive coming in glory... "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths: all flesh shall see the salvation of God." Luke 3:4,6

For the Season of Advent, the sanctuary will be decorated beginning on the altar with the Advent Wreath. The wreath itself is a symbolic circle of evergreen representing everlasting life. The seedpods, nuts and cones used to decorate the wreath are symbolic of Resurrection and the fruits represent the nourishing fruitfulness of the Christian life. Displayed within the wreath are four candles (three purple – penance, one pink – joy) representing the four Sundays in Advent. During each of the Advent Mass celebrations, a candle(s) will be lit symbolizing hope, peace, joy, love, and the *Light* of the world. Draped purple fabric, symbolizing penitence, royalty, and expectation, will be added to the Risen Christ niche and the altar. On the brick columns above the altar, four banners will display the theme tied to each of the four weeks of Advent. For the first two weeks, the banners "Watch" (1st Sunday) and "Prepare" (2nd Sunday) will be depicted. Unembellished Christmas trees will be in place in the Risen Christ niche, candles will be displayed in the windows, a Christmas tree will be in the gathering space for the parish to decorate, and wreaths will be on display at the church entrance... as we wait in *hope* for the wonderous birth.

Thoughts on the Journey Suanne Gettings

November 28, 2021 - Lk 21:25-28,34-36

A group of approximately 130 people set sail from England in 1620 on the Mayflower in search of religious freedom in the New World. These men, women, and children left on their long journey across the Atlantic under crowded and difficult conditions. Since the Mayflower was a cargo ship and not a passenger vessel, adjustments had to be made to accommodate the travelers.

Their voyage lasted about 66 days. They landed on the shores of what is now Cape Cod, in November. They arrived in complete wilderness on the heels of winter. There was no shelter and no provisions when they arrived. The growing season was over, so there were no fresh fruits or vegetables. To sustain themselves, they rationed the food that was left from the voyage.

In order to stay out of the elements, the pilgrims lived on the Mavflower that was anchored in the harbor, but that was not without its problems. Due to the snow, sleet, and frigid winds, the Mayflower often took a beating during those initial months. With no nutritious food, they suffered from malnutrition, scurvy, and other diseases related to poor nutrition, bacteria, and viruses. History tells the story of the women who were vigilant in the care of their children. They often went without sustenance so that their children were fed. Of the eighteen women pilgrims, fourteen died. Twenty of the thirty-one children survived, eleven died. In all of the one hundred thirty-two crew and passengers, only fiftythree survived the first winter.

This is only a thumbnail sketch of the courage, strength and incredible hardships of a pilgrim people committed to an arduous journey - a journey rooted in faith. Even in the face of incredible loss and pain, they still managed to gather together at a feast and give thanks to God. And so it goes for us today, as pilgrims on our journey of faith, seeking everlasting freedom.

In Luke's Gospel, Jesus is speaking to His disciples and warns them of the signs and events related to the coming of the Son of Man. He said to them,

"Beware that your hearts do not become drowsy from carousing and drunkenness and the anxieties of daily life, and that day catch you by surprise like a trap...Be vigilant at all times."

In the past year or two, I have heard more fear expressed about the end times related to chaos, calamity, and suffering in the world. Every generation throughout history has wrestled with this fear. Suffering is part of the human condition and we will all experience it to one degree or another.

So, what can we learn from the pilgrims in this regard? In the midst of their suffering, their fear, their losses, when every day may have felt like their last, they worked their way through the suffering with faith-filled vigilance.

We are all pilgrims on a journey seeking the everlasting freedom that can only come from the love and mercy of God. Each of us will take a different path and, along our way, we will encounter stormy seas; we will be diverted by our sinfulness; we will suffer loss and heartache; we will hang on our own cross at times (sometimes justly by our own making: sometimes by the cruelty of others); we will sometimes feeling as though our prayers are answered and other times, feeling like God has abandoned us.

It is Jesus who understands the pilgrim journey because, through His Incarnation, He made the pilgrim journey Himself. Our Lord ventured to walk the walk. He experienced the sometimes exhausting nature of the road back to the Father and the aches and pains of the human condition. Through it all, He gave thanks to His Father in Heaven. Jesus gave us the perpetual example of thanksgiving in the feast of the Holy Eucharist that feeds us on our journey to everlasting freedom.

As we begin the season of Advent, let us be mindful that we are waiting for our Savior's return. To prepare our hearts, let us shed our fears, stand firm in our faith, stay vigilant, and in all things, give thanks to God.

The origins of the Advent wreath are unclear. Like many holiday traditions, they may be pre-Christian, and like many of today's Christmas traditions. Advent wreaths were popularized by Germans, who brought them to the United States. No matter where they came from or how they differ, Advent wreaths are rich in symbolism. The candles are lit as a sign of hope to dispel the darkness. The evergreen, wrapped in a circle, signifies continuous life. The prickly leaves of holly are like the crown of thorns. Pinecones symbolize resurrection. If you don't already have one, consider making one as a craft project this Advent, and add elements that have symbolic meaning for you.


