

Mary Procession

We invite the children of our parish to lead the congregation in honoring Mary at all of the Masses the weekend of May 14/15. Participation is optional. A statue of Mary will be next to the altar and participating children will process up the aisle, each carrying a flower to place at Mary's feet.

If your child would like to participate, please follow the instructions below:

- 1. Arrive at least 15 minutes prior to Mass time.
- 2. Choose your seats so that your child knows where you will be seated.
- 3. Have your child receive a flower from a volunteer in the gathering space.
- 4. Leave your child in the gathering space with us and return to your seat.

During the prelude, 5 minutes prior to Mass, the children will process down the center aisle with their flowers. After laying their flower in one of the baskets at the feet of Mary, the children will return to where their parents are sitting.

At the Saturday, May 14th 5:00pm Youth Mass, Mary will also be crowned and then Mass will proceed as usual.





Thoughts on the Journey April 24, 2022 - John 20:19-31

The first time I met Jane was when her husband was at the OSU James Hospital. He was being treated for newly diagnosed cancer of the throat and esophagus. She was warm, friendly and open to my pastoral visit. It was as if I had known her for years. We prayed together and I assured her that I would be available for follow-up pastoral visits.

Once her husband, George, was discharged from the hospital, I began regular visits at their home and was amazed at the efforts Jane made to provide care for her husband. Their grown children were not living in the area, so Jane was the sole caregiver. This included feedings through a tube, medicines at different times of the day, suctioning to keep his lungs clear, and a countless number of other details needed to keep George as healthy as possible.

Over the many months I visited with them, I could see the toll caregiving was taking on Jane. She never complained, but there were visual signs that it was all overwhelming. Since George couldn't speak because of the damage cancer had done to his throat, most of my visits were spent talking with Jane. I marveled at her sense of hope and the strength she drew from her faith as well as the great care she gave to George. Jane was an inspiration!

As time went on, Jane and I became good friends. One afternoon when I stopped in to see them, I could tell she had been crying. We sat in the living room where she proceeded to share with me the pain she had been dealing with just before George's diagnoses. He had been cheating on her with another woman. She was prepared to leave him, but her husband's cancer changed everything. She knew George had no one else to care for him and felt she could not leave him under the circumstances. Leaving him would require an explanation to her family as to "why" and she didn't want her adult children to think less of their father. Her tears that day were over her difficulty in forgiving him and forgiving the woman embroiled in his infidelity. Once again, I was inspired by her focus and the depth of her mercy.

In John's Gospel, on this Divine Mercy Sunday, Jesus appeared to His apostles who were huddled in fear after His death and Resurrection. Jesus said to them, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when He had said this, He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

The Apostle Thomas was not present for Jesus' first appearance. When the other apostles shared with him the news, he responded in disbelief and said unless he saw the wounds of Christ's crucifixion, he would not believe. Jesus appeared to the apostles again and this time Thomas was present. allowed him to touch His wounds and told him to believe. Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you come to believe because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

The dictionary defines mercy as "compassion or forgiveness shown toward someone whom it is within one's power to punish or harm." As flawed humans, whose sins are what nailed our Lord to the cross, we deserve punishment. But, instead of His wrath, Jesus stretched out His arms of love and compassion and extended His Divine Mercy to all.

When we have been hurt, it is very difficult to extend mercy. There's a part of us that wants revenge and wants the other to suffer for their transgressions. Secular society would applaud that position but, to be a true believer in Christ, even though we have never seen Him, He calls us to live mercy and forgiveness.

I couldn't help but think of Jane when preparing this reflection for Divine Mercy Sunday. She extended the arms of mercy to someone who betrayed her on a level that most would call unforgivable. believer, Jane wanted the strength to do what her faith demanded of her. She served her undeserving dying husband to the end of his life and brought healing through forgiveness. George received the divine mercy of Christ for his sinfulness, but he also received Jane's mercy through the working of the Holy Spirit. Blessed is Jane who has not seen, but believed: a true path to peace for all involved.

Mark is depicted in art with the symbol of a winged lion—his gospel may be simple and to the point, but the "roar" of his words certainly took flight! Don't underestimate the power of your own words about the Lord—they too may endure!

Martyrs for the poor

On this day in 1998, Guatemalan Bishop Juan Gerardi Conedera was bludgeoned to death for daring to defend the nation's indigenous people. Conedera was not the first Latin American religious leader—nor the last—to be martyred for championing the "least of these" as Jesus did. But the fate of all such martyrs shines a bright light on Catholic Social Teaching as it emerged from pivotal gatherings of Latin American bishops, for instance the Medellín (1968) and Puebla (1979) conferences. Quoting Puebla, how can you make a "preferential option for the poor" today?

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 4:32-37; John 3:7b-15 (268). "So must the Son of Man be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life."

The light outshines the darkness

Holocaust Remembrance Day begins at sundown this evening. The Holocaust was one of the darkest moments in human history. It seemed that evil might triumph over good, darkness over light. The Catholic Church of times past sadly watered the deadly seeds of anti-Semitism. Thankfully that has changed in recent decades. Pope John Paul II was instrumental in his visits to synagogues and reinterpreting the New Testament to avoid the anti-Jewish implications that dominated for centuries. Pope Francis has prayed at the Western Wall and Yad Vashem, denouncing anti-Semitism, standing up for Jews when

anti-Semitism occurs. Just as Easter Sunday comes after the horror of Good Friday, the light does indeed prevail. We are an Easter people.

MEMORIAL OF PETER CHANEL, PRIEST, MARTYR

The stuff that healers are made of

The martyrdom of Marist priest Father Peter Chanel, S.M. on the South Seas island of Fortuna could be an action movie. There's a disgruntled king. A bloody fight. Peter Chanel, healer, steps in to treat the injured man, his enemy by any definition. Chanel momentarily turns, and the enemy rises up and strikes him dead. Chanel's murderer much later undergoes a conversion himself and becomes Christian, as does most of the island. One of Chanel's catechumens had said of him, "He loves us. He does what he teaches. He forgives his enemies. His teaching is good." Your personal battles may be less cinematic, but in the communion of saints, Chanel is available to inspire right action against the odds.

TODAY'S READINGS: Acts 5:27-33; John 3:31-36 (270). "Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life."

MEMORIAL OF CATHERINE OF SIENA, LAY DOMINICAN, DOCTOR OF THE CHURCH

Grounded in love

Saint Catherine of Siena, O.P. models for us balance in our life of prayer and social commitment. Early in her life, she stayed at home and focused fervently on prayer. But God had other plans. Catherine had a vision in which Christ reminded her of the call to love God and neighbor. Catherine's spiritual director wrote that God spoke the following to Catherine: "It is the justice of these two commandments that I want you now to fulfill. On two feet you must walk my way; on two wings you must fly to heaven."

Live free of fear

John Dear is a Catholic priest and longtime peace activist, having been arrested more than 75 times in acts of nonviolent civil disobedience. But it wasn't always that way. When he entered priestly formation, he couldn't imagine himself as an activist. His inspiration was Father Daniel Berrigan, S.J., renowned peace activist, poet, and Jesuit priest who died on this day in 2016. Dear writes: "I first met Dan . . . in the early 1980s . . . I remember asking him how in the world I could ever work for peace. 'What are you afraid of?' he asked me. 'Don't be afraid. Don't live in fear. Live in faith and hope and peace.' I was shocked. No one ever said such things to me. I decided then and there to give it a try. Later, I realized: we all need a teacher who tells us not to be afraid." Whatever your particular calling, don't let fear keep you from being your fullest, Christ-like self.




