

Questions Catholics Ask

Why do Catholics believe in the Assumption of Mary?

In this question we put two dogmas together: belief in the Blessed Virgin Mary's Assumption and in the virgin birth of Jesus. We might add the Immaculate Conception of Mary, because a discussion of one of these touches on them all. Theologian Sister Elizabeth Johnson, C.S.J. calls these dogmas "prophecy in the midst of the history of suffering." Prophetic statements are matters of faith and not available for scientific validation.

Nor do these dogmas necessarily spring from the record of Scripture. Chapterand-verse proof-texts for the Assumption and the Immaculate Conception in particular are unsatisfying because neither event is covered in the New Testament. The Assumption was formally declared ("promulgated") as dogma in 1950 by Pope Pius XII, but that doesn't mean the church has only recently taught it.

The early church fathers don't address the matter of Mary's departure from this world, but possibly as early as the 3rd century the tradition of Mary's "transitus" recounted her bodily reception into heaven. Roman Catholics, Eastern Orthodox, and even some Anglicans hold some version of the Assumption in their traditions: Roman Catholicism does not define whether Mary "fell asleep" or "died" before her body was taken up.

The theological argument for the Assumption is one of "fittingness." Mary is the Ark of God's new covenant in Christ. She was preserved from sin for this end (her Immaculate Conception) and should not undergo the corruption of death (see Romans 6:23 on the wages of sin). Her body, given over to God's

purposes in the divine plan of salvation, became a vessel too sacred to be discarded or forgotten afterwards. Scholastic thinkers like Aguinas and Bonaventure used the Latin phrase "potuit, voluit, fecit" to sum up the idea: God "could do it, willed it, and did it."

Perhaps a more humanly compelling argument arose in the wake of the 20th century's two brutal world wars. Pius XII surveyed the ghastly indignities suffered by the human body in recent memory and saw an opportunity to teach emphatically that God cares what happens to our mortal flesh. Mary's exalted destiny may bring "clearly to the notice of all persons" the destiny of our bodies and souls. You and I are also vessels of divine life too precious to God to forget.

Come do great things! This fall, children in grades PreK-8 will be enrolled in weekly religious education to learn more about Jesus and the Catholic faith. 




Interview by Chris Stefanick:

Each year, an area the size of South Carolina is deforested worldwide, adding to biodiversity loss and contributing significantly to planetary warming. Make sure the lumber you (or your contractor) use for your next project carries the Forest Stewardship Council (FSC) certification. The FSC program is an independent, nongovernmental, nonprofit organization established to promote the sustainable management of the world's forests. Evaluation is typically performed by an independent third party. Certification can assure consumers that they are buying forest-related products that were grown, harvested and processed sustainably, protecting the resource for future generations.

Thoughts on the Journey

August 14, 2022. 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time Luke 12:49-53

My mother, Jackie, was a strong and passionate advocate for the underdog throughout her life. When she was a young girl, she was part of the country's war effort to collect cans to help fight the evils of Hitler; it was her contribution and she was proud of it. Her brother Fred was developmentally delayed and was often bullied. Word got around quickly not to mess with Fred because they would have to take on Jackie - a force with which to be reckoned. When a group of Christian black men formed an organization improve conditions in the inner-city neighborhood of Avondale, she was the only white person who stood in solidarity with them, attending city council meetings and participating in their community efforts. When Parenthood distributina Planned began condoms and inappropriate materials to grade school children, she started the Parent's Rights Organization in the city to inform parents what was taking place in the schools. When abortion clinics began popping up in Cincinnati, she was front and center in protest at the Board of Health, became a founding member of the Pregnancy Problem Center in Western Hills, and took in young girls who needed support during and after their pregnancies.

Jackie was often referred to as a *spitfire*. She was loved by many and at the same time was seen by those who opposed her views, as a royal pain in the rump. Whether at home or in the community, her first pledge of allegiance was to Christ. Her God was the fire within her that gave her strength and resolve to stand up for what she believed to be right, regardless of what others thought - regardless of the price. As one of her nine kids, I was a front-row witness to her faith in action. I also saw how her inner fire was a catalyst, stoking the flame within others, and inspiring them to get involved. Jackie also took

on the heat of controversy and criticism, trusting that God was with her through it all.

In the Gospel of Luke, Jesus is talking to His disciples and says to them,

"I have come to set the earth on fire, and how I wish it were already blazing!

Jesus further tells them that He did not come to establish peace on earth, but division. He wanted them to understand that His message was not going to sit well with many and will create division between those who believe and those who don't.

From the very beginning, the life and ministry of Jesus were marked with peace, compassion, mercy and love. His ministry was also marked by conflict that eventually led to His death. He did not come to bring us bland moral platitudes or console us with sentimentality, but rather to show us the way, the truth, and the light that will lead us home to His Father. His living example and His teachings involved the conversion of mind and spirit; which requires repentance, an end to sin in our lives, and a call to love, serve, and forgive. Let's face it, truth is hard to hear and the path of conversion is hard work.

As I look at the state of the world these days, I can't help but see division and conflict caused by evil colliding with good. We've gone down many slippery slopes in our society that are violating humanity and the sanctity and dignity of who we are as God's children. The alarms are sounding all around us! Can you hear them?

Fortunately, there are many people of faith who have the fire of Jesus burning within them. They are our hope because they carry the torch of discipleship. It is that divine light that will change the world. Staying deeply united to Jesus we, too, can change the world.



Make some noise for justice

Civil rights activist and Presidential Medal of Freedom recipient Congressman John Lewis hoped young Americans might get in trouble. "Good trouble, necessary trouble," he specified. Lewis wished that a passion for what's right might compel our young citizens to "find a way to get in the way" of injustice. A young prophet named Jeremiah once got in the way, winding up at the bottom of a well and nearly starving to death for causing trouble for his king. Jesus promises the same sort of trouble in our families if some members are baptized with fire while others don't feel the burn. Find yourself some good trouble.

TWENTIETH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME TODAY'S READINGS: Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10; Hebrews 12:1-4; Luke 12:49-53 (120). "He will die of famine on the spot, for there is no more food in the city."

Monday, Aug 15, 2022

Grief requited

Given that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was likely in her teens when she gave birth, she was probably only in her late 40s when Jesus died 33 years later. Life expectancy was a lot shorter then, but potentially Mary could have been alive for many years after seeing her son for the last time. One ancient historian wrote that she died 11 years later. It must have been a time of intense longing for her. Whether she died before she was bodily assumed into heaven or was assumed before she died is left open-ended by the church. Either way, it was an extraordinary reunion with the Lord befitting her status. Consider your own reunion with God. Plan ahead!

Embrace the mystery of communion

Brother Roger Schütz, founder of the Taizé movement, died on this date in 2005. Brother Roger began Taizé in 1940 in the French countryside, envisioning a humble monastic community to respond to the needs of war-torn refugees—but also to welcome followers from all Christian denominations. The simple house he purchased eventually blossomed into a global place of pilgrimage, especially for young people. Taizé is especially known for beautiful chants still used in congregations all over the world. "The Church is a mystery of communion," Brother Roger wrote, where we "can discover an aurora of reconciliation and the practicing of a simple joy." Pray with Taizé through their website.

On this day in 1887, Marcus Garvey, one of the most influential black activists of his generation, was born in Jamaica. Founder of Universal Negro Improvement Association, a fraternal organization that he grew into an international powerhouse after emigrating to the United States, he is credited with coining the term "Black is beautiful" to encourage racial pride. Though controversial in many of his views, he is remembered for his advocacy for racial

equality and economic justice. Be a voice for equality and justice as you live out your unique Christian mission.

TODAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 34:1-11; Matthew 20:1-16 (421). "You have made them equal to us."

Thursday, Aug 18, 2022

Be willing to look closely

On this day in 1998 the renowned Holocaust scholar Harry James Cargas died. Most of his teaching and writing focused on the Christian response to the Holocaust. What haunted him, he once said, was that "probably every Jew killed in the Holocaust was murdered by a baptized Christian." Cargas could have chosen an easier academic path, but instead he forced Christians to take stock of their complicity. Today's Psalm is a good help for examining our own cooperation with contemporary sin: "A clean heart create for me, O God."

TODAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 36:23-28; Matthew 22:1-14 (422). "Many are invited, but few are chosen."

Friday, Aug 19, 2022

Keep it simple

Saint John Eudes, a 17th-century priest and mystic, worked tirelessly to spread the gospel message, which he feared was being corrupted by various heresies. For Saint John, Christianity wasn't complicated: "The Christian life is a continuation and completion of the life of Christ in us. We should be so many Christs here on Earth, continuing His life and His works, laboring and suffering in a holy and divine manner in the spirit of Jesus." And just what was Christ's work? Look no further than the two great commandments he gave us: "Love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind," and "Love your neighbor as yourself."

TODAY'S READINGS: Ezekiel 37:1-14; Matthew 22:34-40 (423). "The whole law and the prophets depend on these two commandments."

Saturday, Aug 20, 2022

Schism-saver

In 1130, Pope Honorius II was dying. In anticipation of his death, a group of cardinals agreed on Cardinal Gregory Papareschi as the next pope. Upon Honorius' death, Papareschi was elected Pope Innocent II. But another group of cardinals had another cardinal in mind for the position, Cardinal Pietro Pierleoni, and elected him as Pope Anacletus II. The church then had a pope and an antipope. Question was, which was which? Saint Bernard of Clairvaux threw his considerable weight and hard work behind Pope Innocent, who eventually prevailed, preventing what easily could have spiraled into a schism. Remember this lesson from Bernard: "If you are to do the work of a prophet, what you need is not a sceptre but a hoe."




