#### **INFANTS & CHILDREN:**

In the Infant Rite of Baptism, celebrated with children up to the age of reason, the parents make a profession of faith for their child and accept the responsibility of nurturing God's gift of faith in their child as he/she grows and matures and is formed in many ways. Therefore, parents are asked to attend a Parent Preparation Session, preferably during pregnancy, before the baptism of each child. The goal of this session is to provide an opportunity for faith reflection and sharing with the support of other parents. The discussion centers on the celebration of the sacrament of Baptism and the challenges of our own faith and how we might pass our faith on to our children.

Sessions are usually held at 12:30 p.m. on the 4th Sunday of the month, in the OLR Chapel.

#### Questions Catholics Ask <sup>\*</sup>

Two Americans were Beatified by Pope Francis. What Do I Need to Know About



Father Stanley Rother

The U.S. saints roster is exploding lately. Growing up with statues of Teresas, Francis, Anthony, and Patrick, we may have imagined sainthood as a European phenomenon. Today's young Catholics learn about 12 canonized

U.S. saints and eight beatified ones. In addition, an astonishing 18 Venerables have been named by the last three popes, all candidates for canonization. Their stories challenge us to consider that holiness is achievable—and expected—in the U.S. church.

The "Blesseds" who share in the American story (with beatification dates in parentheses) are: Mary Frances Schervier, who resided only briefly in this country (1974): Diego Luis de San Vitores, martyred in Guam (1985); Francis Xavier Seelos, who died ministering to vellow fever victims in New Orleans (2000); Carlos Manuel Rodríguez Santiago, catechist of Puerto Rico (2001); Eduardo Farré and Lucas Tristany, pastors in Tucson, Arizona, recalled to Spain and martyred during the Spanish Civil War (2007); and the latest two, Miriam Teresa Demianovich, mystic from New Jersey (2014) and Stanley Rother, diocesan priest from Oklahoma martyred in Guatemala (2017).

Even saving "mystic from New Jersey" sounds new. Holy living isn't confined to the long ago and far away anymore. Miriam Teresa Demianovich (1901-1927) was born in Bayonne, New Jersey. Her parents were immigrants from Slovakia. As a teenager, Teresa felt a vocation to the convent. The early death of her mother, however, led her to remain home with her father until he died in 1926. While at home, she took classes at a college run by Sisters of Charity. After her father's death, she entered their order. Teresa's deep spirituality was so apparent she was asked as a novice to write anonymous instructions for the other sisters. Her book, Greater Perfection, passed from her community to the public, and has inspired millions globally. Sister Teresa herself died a year after her entry to the community.

Stanley Rother (1935-1981) was born on a farm in Okarche, Oklahoma. Feeling called to priesthood, he was sent to seminary in San Antonio but performed poorly in the required Latin and was dismissed. He was able to complete his studies at Mount Saint Mary's in Maryland in 1963. After serving five years in an Oklahoma parish. Father Rother went to the diocesan mission in Guatemala. where he learned both Spanish and Tz'utujil skillfully. Thirteen years later, his life was threatened during the civil war that claimed hundreds of thousands of Catholics. Recalled to Oklahoma, he insisted on returning to his adopted people: "The shepherd cannot run." Back in Guatemala, he was murdered in his home a month after his return.



**ROE REMEMBERANCE JANUARY 23.2023 Respect for Life Mass** Saint Joseph Cathedral at 10:30 am **ROE Remembrance Event, at the State House Immediately Following Mass** 



Since 1974, the March for Life has taken place in Washington, DC, to mark the landmark decision of Roe v. Wade by the Supreme Court of the United States. Every January since then, many thousands of people have been showing up in that cold month for this march to protest that landmark ruling. The ruling was very controversial over the years, and people have been lining up on either side of the political aisle over it. Counter all that with the most recent Supreme Court ruling in June of 2022, overturning Roe. Unfortunately, all this has caused disharmony among many Catholics.

What has remained constant is the Church's teaching on abortion. Human life is sacred and should be protected from conception to natural death. Despite this, many Catholics believe that women have a right to choose.

In the spirit of continued discernment over the sacredness of human life, the Pro-Life Ministry asks you to consider reflecting on some of the petitions made in the *Litany* to Jesus in the Womb of Mary. The divine creation of Jesus, both God, and man, in the womb of Mary profoundly points to the sacredness of life in every womb of every woman.

- \*Jesus, begotten by God nourished by the substance and blood of the most Holy Mother, have mercy on us.
- \*Jesus adored and contemplated by His Mother in the sanctuary of her womb, have mercy on us.
- \*Jesus whose Sacred Heart, began beating in the womb of Mary, have mercy on us.
- \*Jesus our protector and Savior asleep in the inviolable womb of Mary, have mercy on us.



# Creation Care Corner

#### Turning Down the Gas

A big challenge in caring for creation is reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Methane is a powerful greenhouse gas that often leaks into the atmosphere. It is a significant contributor to global warming. Sources include oil and gas mining, landfills, agriculture, and even leaks in the pipes that bring natural gas (methane) into our homes for fuel. When natural gas is burned for fuel it creates CO2, which is also a GHG. In our homes, it can create air quality issues as well.

Electrification of space and water heating, as well as cooking appliances, is an enormous opportunity to cut greenhouse gas pollution and save money on energy bills. Electric heat pumps heat homes and water far more efficiently than fossil-fuel appliances. Induction stoves and cooktops are also more energy efficient than their gas counterparts. Where possible, as your natural gas-powered appliances reach the end of their life, investigate converting to newer electric appliances for a more sustainable future. 



# WELCOMING CHILDREN **AT MASS**



### ALL ARE WELCOME -LET THE CHILDREN COME!

As parents, and leaders of our domestic church, we are responsible for forming our children in our Catholic faith. How then can we not welcome children – the future of the Church – at Mass?

In taking our children to Mass we operate on the principle that we need to teach our children how to be in church as long as it does not distract others around us from their prayer. Some days are better than others, but the gift of passing on how we pray as Catholics is worth all of the challenges.

There is no more important experience to Catholics than the Mass, so it is crucial to help children understand and participate in the liturgy as much as they are able. Our primary job is to make sure they "get" what happens at Mass. What better way to do that than to have children of all ages in the pews right along with us?

Church of the Resurrection has many options and opportunities for families with young children:

We know that young children can get wiggly and restless – and that's okay! To help keep them settled, *Mass Bags* are available at the *Parent Resource Center* located in the Gathering Space. These bags are filled with religiously themed books and activities that will help keep children engaged in the mass. Parents are welcome to take a bag with them into Mass and then return it afterward.

There are *Quieting Rooms* located in the rear of the church on both sides of the Sanctuary. These rooms are available for parents of infants to retreat to when dealing with a fussy baby or toddler. Once you have settled your little one, you may return to your pew. Each Quieting Room is equipped with a rocking chair that can be a blessing to nursing mothers.

Children ages 3 through 1<sup>st</sup> grade are also invited to attend *Journey with Jesus* – a program just for them where they will hear and explore the readings and gospel at their own level. They are dismissed during the Liturgy of the Word and return to their families during the Offertory. There is no registration needed, simply send your children when the celebrant calls the children forward.

While it would be ideal to enjoy an uplifting and distraction-free Mass, we should be focusing on the fact that Jesus shed His Precious Blood for all of us -- the nursing babies, the fidgety toddlers, the disabled, the young, and the old. None of us is worthy to be in the presence of Christ, but He shows up anyway. Not only should we show up, too, but we should welcome everyone -- young or old, big or small -- who has come to the Lord's Supper.

Jesus invites all of us to His table -- and He extended a special invitation to children, saying, "Let the little children come to me."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, "Racism and every form of discrimination ... must be curbed and eradicated as incompatible with God's design." Lift a hand to help in your community, and pray that love banish hate.

The Apophthegmata Patrum is a 1,600-year-old collection of writings known as the Sayings of the Desert Fathers. These texts record the teachings of the earliest Christian monks, who congregated in the desert of Egypt. The wisest among these monks was Anthony the Abbot. He wrote: "Just as fish die if they stay too long out of water, so the monks who loiter outside their cells or pass their time with men of the world lose the intensity of inner peace." When Christianity became politically accepted—and martyrdoms ceased-Anthony sought the desert to experience a different kind of sacrifice. There he found silence and solitude, too. Seek God in silence today.

It's not just that 12 is a handy number for grouping things, it also carries symbolic value. It signifies completion or fullness. Twelve eggs, for example, means you have a full carton. And 12 apostles means the church has everything it needs to preach the Good News. Count your spiritual blessings-by the dozen!


