

INFANTS & CHILDREN:



Questions Catholics Ask

Why are there parishes?



The necessity for established, well-defined parish boundaries was identified at the Council of Trent (1545-1563) as a way to protect pastors and their communities from the harm that evolved from uncertain lines of authority and property. The original trouble was

grounded in the feudal system: In earlier times the church was by no means separate from the state, as it is in most countries today. The notion of a parish with canonically (that is, by church law) protected rights and responsibilities serves to clarify what you and I "get"—and have a right to—when we join up.

Parish boundaries aren't always geographically defined. Most are designated by territory, but they can also be defined by language, rite, ethnicity, or other elements that serve the community. For example, in large U.S. cities a French or Korean parish might serve all who speak those languages primarily. There's also a military diocese that encompasses U.S. service folk wherever they may be, creating parishes anywhere armed forces personnel are serving. Rites in communion with Rome, like Maronites, Melkites, Ukrainians, and others, establish parishes defined less by geography than by the particular liturgy customary for those communities.

As a Catholic you may worship freely in any of these parishes or all of them if you wish. But there are advantages to registering with a particular parish—whether or not you live inside its technical boundaries—that are worth considering. A parish is defined by four basic elements.

First, it stands to serve a certain segment of the People of God. Second, it's administered by a priest specifically charged with its sacramental care (even a parish with a nonordained administrator on-site reports to a member of the clergy who holds the official title of pastor). Third, a parish is governed by church law which outlines reciprocal rights and duties of pastor and parishioners. Finally, a parish is guaranteed a suitable site containing all that's necessary for the Catholic spiritual life: Eucharistic equipment, baptismal font, confessional, cemetery, and a place for sacramental records to be kept. Those who register with a particular parish will have full access to all that's necessary for Catholic identity when the time comes. Trust a former parish secretary here: Get on the books. It makes your sacramental life easier!







THIS WEEK'S **STEWARDSHIP** RECOMMENDATION: Be Salt Wise This Winter.

Salt can infiltrate and permanently pollute groundwater and streams. Use the minimal amount needed.

- 1. Shovel Clear walkways and other areas before the snow turns to ice.
- 2. Scatter If you use salt, scatter it so that there is space between the grains. A 12-ounce coffee mug of salt is enough to treat an entire 20-foot driveway.
- 3. Switch When pavement temperatures drop below 15 degrees, salt won't work. Switch to sand for traction or a different ice melter that works at lower temperatures (i.e., calcium chloride).
- 4. Store Correctly Store ice melting products in airtight containers to maintain maximum effectiveness.







Thoughts on the Journey

February 5, 2023 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time Matthew 5:13-16 Suanne Gettings

At one time or another, we have all probably heard, "Yes. I'm a Christian, but my faith is private." We may have even said it ourselves. The essence of that reasoning goes something like, "I am a Christian, but I don't want anyone to notice." Reflecting on the gospel from Matthew this week, I couldn't help but wonder, what Jesus would say about that kind of thinking.

Jesus delivered the Sermon on the Mount on the northern slope of the Sea of Galilee. It was there He made it clear what His expectations were for those who truly wanted to be His devoted followers. He said to His Disciples as He says to us.

"You are the salt of the earth... you are the light of the world"

Jesus' use of the words 'earth' and 'world' indicate that our Christian influence should impact the world globally, beginning where we live: in our homes, at school, at work, in our communities, and beyond. Jesus calls us to live the beatitudes so that our Christian actions and reactions move outward and make a difference. Can salt go unnoticed when it seasons our food? Can light go unnoticed if it penetrates the darkness? Do we think that Jesus wants us to go quietly amid the noise of a broken secular world going unnoticed? Absolutely not and we know this by His God-given mandate to advance the gospel by how we live and love.

There are many examples of people who understand what it means to be salt and light. We have a community of people who glorify our Lord by living this mandate. There are many examples of faith in action, but here is just one for the sake of this article: Our El Salvador Ministry has been part of our parish outreach for many years. Their mission is to support the staff, the children, and their families of the PNAR Catholic School in Agua Caliente, El Salvador, through prayer and resources. Many of our

parishioners sponsor the students who otherwise would be unable to afford to attend the school. Sponsorship includes books. uniforms, tuition, a safe environment for learning, and much more.

Under the leadership of the Holy Spirit, Larry Savage, and a committee of dedicated people, we see the transforming nature of living Jesus' mandate to be salt of the earth and light to the world. Thru fortitude, persistence, good example, and fostering relationships with the school community, tremendous progress has been made over the years. Over 200 children are currently enrolled; that number has grown substantially and hopes to continue growing. A once dependent people are now taking ownership of their school. With the hard work of the school staff, in cooperation with students and their families, they are making it thrive bringing light to their community.

There are ongoing zoom meetings with people from our El Salvador Ministry and members of the school staff. People from our parish have made trips to El Salvador to bring resources and encouragement. It's inspiring to witness the incredible cooperation of everyone working together as a global community of faith.. we, in Ohio and they, in El Salvador. These are disciples who are willing to be noticed for their service to others, not for their own glorification. As a result, people are witnessing the good that they do and giving glory to God. We are all called to be salt and light regardless of how old we are or what we do. It's a mindset that strengthens the flavor of what we believe so that others want to taste it. It brings light to the Christ within us illuminating the way so that others will follow.

No! Jesus doesn't want us to keep our faith private nor does He want us to go unnoticed. He tells us to go out into the world and let our light shine for all to see!

He said he hoped his blood would fall as "fruitful rain." May his gentle words and brave witness nourish your prayer today.

How to help a good cause

Six individuals are in line to become the first African-American saint: Sister Thea Bowman, Julia Greeley, Mother Mary Lange, Mother Henriette Delille, Father Augustus Tolton, and Pierre Toussaint. The first three have the title "servant of God," indicating their canonization cause has been launched. The latter three have the title "venerable," meaning the pope recognizes their heroic virtue. Next would come beatification, allowing candidates to be called "blessed"; it includes the church's confirmation that they are in heaven-evidenced by at least two miracles from their intercession (unless they're martyred). Finally, comes canonization. Learn about these six and seek their intercession

Wednesday, Feb 08, 2023

Saintly guidance to help end modern-day slavery

This day marks the International Day of Prayer and Awareness Against Human Trafficking—also the feast of the first and only black woman saint in modern times: the Sudanese nun Josephine Bakhita. Kidnapped into slavery as a child by Arab traffickers in the late 19th century, she was converted to Islam before eventually being left in the care of Canossian Sisters in Italy. Her freedom soon came, and she lived out her later life as a Catholic and

eventually a nun. Today, an estimated 50 million people live in modern-day slavery. Christians are among the greatest combatants of the trade, and Saint Josephine was named the patron of survivors when she was canonized in 2000. May her faith continue to inspire those working to end the scourge, and may we join their efforts.

Seeing Adam's rib with fresh eyes

Traditionally, today's first reading has been used as a cudgel to keep women in divinely sanctioned inferiority. In the past century, scholars have looked differently at Genesis. Eve being created last doesn't imply inferiority, they say; human creation came after the rest of creation and traditionally was seen as implying superiority (which is actually another idea now under question). Also, many say a "partner" for Adam would imply equal status. Scripture interpretation depends heavily on the culture and on who is doing the interpreting. May the Holy Spirit inspire each one of us to advance human dignity.

TODAY'S READINGS: Genesis 2:18-25; Mark 7:24-30 (332). "This one, at last, is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh."

Togetherness has its virtue

Saint Scholastica (480-543) is the patron of Benedictine nuns and sisters. Along with her brother Saint Benedict of Nursia, she helped establish a rule for monastic living that emphasized prayer, work, and peace. Contemporary Benedictine women continue to follow this ancient set of precepts. The vision of monastic life, as expressed in the 2022 Centennial Prayer of the Benedictine Federation of Saint Scholastica is to "see Christ at the heart of all creation and at the center of our common life" and "share the peace of Christ, show the love of Christ, and make Christ known in our world." In what ways does your own life within family and community give witness to the peace and love of Christ?

Our hands, God's hands

Today is World Day of the Sick, an observation introduced by Pope John Paul II as a way for believers to serve those suffering from illnesses.
