Parents attend a Parent Preparation Session (preferably during pregnancy) before the child's baptism, usually held at 12:30 p.m. on the 4th Sunday of the month, in the OLR Chapel. 


Christ and Pints



COTR Playgroup

Journey with Jesus

JOURNEY WITH JESUS is our children's Liturgy of the Word program for children 3 years of age through 1st grade. This program is designed to teach the Sunday Mass readings at the child's age level. No registration is needed. Held during the 9am and 11am Sunday masses, the children begin in the church with their family and are sent forth as a group prior to the Liturgy of the Word. They return to the church during the Offertory.

CREED (PreK- 5th)

CREED (Church of the Resurrection Elementary Education Days) is our weekly religious education program for children in grades Pre-K through 5. The focus of the CREED program is to assist parents in their role as the primary religious educators of their children by providing religious education and formation classes for children of the parish who attend area public schools.

RISE (6-8th Grade)

RISE is our weekly faith formation program for middle school students. Fostering the faith of young adolescents involves helping them to make connections between the Catholic faith and everyday life. Registration for RISE is on-going via the parish website.

Confirmation (9th)

This is the final sacrament of initiation into the Catholic Church. Through Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives you an increased ability to practice their Catholic faith in every aspect of their lives and to witness Christ in every situation. Confirmation classes for this year have already started so please check back in the Fall for next year's registration.



Ignite (Grades 9-12th)



Gospel Meditation

November 19, 2023- 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the investability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, get it out of our possession. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it.

Practicing Catholic— Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments

What Remains by Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

When my grandfather died, my parents, siblings, and I were left with the question: what's to become of the house?

Anyone who has inherited property knows that it's not simply a matter of assuming ownership of a plot of land upon which sits four walls and a roof. Those four walls and a roof usually contain memories and objects — an enormous volume of both, in the case of my grandfather. When they're left to you, you have to sift through them, the memories and the objects, and with each one you have to think: Is it worth it? Do I keep it? Will I need it?

And slowly, painfully, you disassemble the physical existence of the person who lived here. You accept, with a pang, that most of it must be given away or discarded. You cry when you bag up the clothes to take to Goodwill. You can't even bear to look when they break the piano into a hundred pieces and throw it in a dumpster, realizing that no one wants or has a use for something that was once so precious.

But when you come upon a rosary that was used so many times it has begun to fall apart, you don't even think twice before keeping it, and not because you need the rosary. You need what it means. You need what it reminds you of.

When all is said and done, each of us will be called before our master to settle accounts, just as my grandfather was.

"Where are the gifts I gave you? What remains of the fortune to which I entrusted you?" he will ask us. "What have you done with the peace? What have you done with the love? What have you done with the mercy?"

The Year of Eucharistic Revival— Draw Closer to the Eucharist

Eucharistic Miracle of Ettiswil, Switzerland-1447

The most important document that describes the miracle is the "Protocol of Justice". This was compiled on July 16, 1447 by Hermann von Russeg, Lord of Buron. Its translation reads: "On Wednesday, May 23, 1447, the Blessed Sacrament was stolen from the parish Church of Ettiswil, and soon after it was found by Margaret Schulmeister, a young lady who had a swineherd. The Holy Eucharist was not far from the parish church, close to the fence and thrown on the ground among nettles, and looked like a bright flower." After close investigation, the police arrested a young lady, Anna Vögtli from Bischoffingen, who soon of her own accord, confessed everything: "Having slipped my hand in the narrow iron gate, I got hold of the large Host. But as soon as I went beyond the cemetery wall, the Host became so heavy that I was unable to carry the Sacred Host any longer. Being unable to go forward or to go backward, I threw away the Host, close to a fence in the nettles". The Sacred Host was discovered by Fraulein Margaret Schulmeister, a swineherd. She stated that "Once I arrived with my pigs close to the place where the Blessed Sacrament had been thrown, my animals did not want to go further. I asked the help of two men who were passing by on their horses. The two men saw in the grass the stolen Host divided in seven Sections. Six of the Sections formed a flower similar to a rose and a great light was surrounding Them." The local parish priest was informed. He at once, together with all the parishioners, went there to pick up the Host and to bring the Sacred Host back to the church. He picked up the six Sections, but when he wanted to pick up the main central Section, this stuck to the ground before everybody's eyes. This partition was interpreted as a sign, and it was decided to build a chapel precisely at that place where the Host had disappeared. The six Sections were kept in the church of Ettiswil and became a Sacred Object of great veneration by the inhabitants of the village and of foreigners. God performed many miracles there. The chapel and the altar were consecrated on December 28, 1448: a year and half after the events.

Building the Kingdom of God is a mission assigned to all of us. God never intended for us to take on this mission alone. He gave us the gift of community made up of people with various God-given gifts, talents, and abilities. God uses His people to get His work done, each one contributing to the life of the community. Good stewardship is sharing with others the gifts that God has given them. Good stewards not only contribute financially, but also their time, talents, and resources according to their ability. Church of the Resurrection has been blessed with many faith-filled people who understand the importance of our mission and the stewardship that helps to make it a thriving community for the glory and honor of God. There's Pat who changes the messages on our outdoor church sign, there's Ted who coordinates the parish adopt-a-highway program, all the musicians who participate in the parish music program, the liturgical ministers, those who volunteer for the C.R.E.E.D. and youth ministries, the office volunteers, those who volunteer to count the collection each week...and the list goes on.

Last month, one of our good and faithful servants, after a bout with Alzheimers, finished his mission on earth to return to his Father in heaven. Ed Woodman was a humble servant who used everything God had given him to serve not only our church community, but the community at large. He used his hands to craft many of the beautiful wood pieces in our church, he helped build the children's swing-set at Lynd's orchard, and anything else he was asked to craft. He used his mind to serve as parish council president, to help coordinate various spiritual parish programs, to serve the Gahanna-Jefferson school district, and to serve on a number of committees over the years, too numerous to mention. Ed shared his spiritual gifts to enlighten and inspire others including his battle with cancer and the profound implications it had on his life of

faith. He participated in the parish healing prayer ministry, the Adult Faith Formation ministry, Knights of Columbus. As much as Ed did in service to others, he never expected or wanted praise or acknowledgement. He did it for the honor and glory of God and to share Christ's love with others through his good work. His contributions to our community and the generous spirit with which he gave, will have a rippling influence for quite some time.

In Matthew's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples the Parable of the Talents, where a man going on a journey entrusts his servants with his possessions. To one he entrusted five talents, to another two talents, and to another one talent. The first two servants doubled the amount whereas the third, with only one talent buried it. Upon the master's return, he did an accounting of each servant's money. He was pleased with the first two servants who doubled their amounts.

His master said to them, 'Well done, my good and faithful servants. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy.'

To the third servant, who buried what the master had given him out of fear, he was admonished by the master who called him a lazy servant demanding that his talent be taken and given to the servant who had ten. The master going on a journey represents Jesus' ascension. The slaves represent Christians who are awaiting the Second Coming. The talents represent the blessings (financial, social, intellectual, etc.) with which God has bestowed on us. The man's return represents Jesus' Second Coming. The master's assessment of the faithfulness of the slaves represents Jesus' judgment of us on Judgment Day.

This Parable of the Talents is relevant to us today. We are called to be ready for the Second Coming of Jesus. The day or the hour of his coming is irrelevant. As difficult as it can be at times, a constant state of readiness and faithful stewardship over that which God has given us, is what will bring us to eternal life. Ed Woodman lived his life treasuring all that God had given him. He didn't keep those treasures to himself, but rather multiplied what he had by sharing it with God's people. I, for one, was inspired by his faithfulness, generosity, and obedience and trust in Christ. Ed accepted the many responsibilities he was given and handled them as a true servant. My hope is that he is resting in peace sharing his Master's joy.

If you haven't before, try *lectio divina* (Latin for "divine reading")—it's a traditional monastic form of praying with scripture in a meditative way to open ourselves to hearing what God is saying to us and listening for our own interior response. Scripture isn't just text, it's the Living Word—strike up a conversation!

According to tradition, Mary's parents—an elderly Anne and Joachim—were so grateful for the unexpected birth of their daughter, they presented her in the Temple to thank God. Accounts also say the toddler Mary "danced with joy" on the third step of the Temple, signifying her future role. Other qualities of the Blessed Mother, present even from her youth, are enumerated in the "Ten Evangelical Virtues of Mary" that we're all encouraged to emulate as Christians: pure, prudent, humble, faithful, devout, obedient, poor, patient, merciful, and sorrowful. Cultivate these in your own life by praying the Virtues of Mary chaplet used by the Marian religious order since 1699.

Whichever version you read, it's clear that God wants us to make the most of what we've been given—and that he recognizes our efforts! In honor of today's Feast of Saint Cecilia, patron of music and musicians, enjoy Anton

Bruckner's *Te Deum* as performed by the talented musicians of the Accademia Nazionale di Santa Cecilia (National Academy of St. Cecilia, founded under Pope Sixtus V in 1585) or check out the contemporary namesake band La Santa Cecilia, recipient of the 2013 Grammy for Best Latin Rock Album (Alternative or Urban).

Because Thanksgiving brings together family members, personalities sometimes grate, children might misbehave, and the gravy surely will spill. It's an ideal day to practice what the Catechism of the Catholic Church calls the "cardinal virtues": prudence (think before you act), justice (be fair), fortitude (don't give up), and temperance (maintain your equilibrium). These virtues smooth out the bumps in human interaction. Ask God to increase in you the virtue you most need for a happy celebration today.

Follow the rule

"Keep the rule, and the rule will keep you." In this monastic proverb, "rule" refers to the daily rhythm of life for monks and nuns that is grounded in their foundation and charism as a community and oriented toward Jesus the Christ. The rule helps the community develop habits for prayer, work, relationships, study, and even play. Monastics still follow a rule of life, as do other intentional communities. Each of us can develop a rule of life according to our own daily rhythm and relationship with God. This rule will keep us grounded, even when the inevitable storms of life roll in.

No room for violence

On this day in 1960 a trio of courageous sisters was brutally assassinated for opposing the murderous regime of Dominican dictator Rafael Trujillo. Since 1993, the U.N. has commemorated World Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women in honor of the Mirabal sisters. It is an appropriate coincidence that today we also honor Catherine of Alexandria, a young convert martyred at the tender age of 18 during Roman persecutions around the year 300. She was reportedly subject to terrible tortures, but her courage instead attracted hundreds more converts. No woman should have to endure violence for any reason. Today is a day we can honor martyrs both modern and ancient with a firm "No más, no more."
