

YOUTH PROGRAMS AND OPPORTUNITIES

COTR Playgroup

RISE (6-8th Grade)

RISE is our weekly faith formation program for middle school students. Fostering the faith of young adolescents involves helping them to make connections between the Catholic faith and everyday life. Registration for RISE is on-going via the parish website.

Journey with Jesus

JOURNEY WITH JESUS is our children's Liturgy of the Word program for children 3 years of age through 1st grade. This program is designed to teach the Sunday Mass readings at the child's age level. No registration is needed. Held during the 9am and 11am Sunday masses, the children begin in the church with their family and are sent forth as a group prior to the Liturgy of the Word. They return to the church during the Offertory.

CREED (PreK-5th)

CREED (Church of the Resurrection Elementary Education Days) is our weekly religious education program for children in grades Pre-K through 5. The focus of the CREED program is to assist parents in their role as the primary religious educators of their children by providing religious education and formation classes for children of the parish who attend area public schools.

Confirmation (9th)

This is the final sacrament of initiation into the Catholic Church. Through Confirmation, the Holy Spirit gives you an increased ability to practice their Catholic faith in every aspect of their lives and to witness Christ in every situation. Confirmation classes for this year have already started so please check back in the Fall for next year's registration.

Ignite (Grades 9-12th)

At Ignite we explore the Truth of the Gospel and discuss how it applies to our lives. Ignite gives you the opportunity to: Ask tough questions; deepen your relationship with Christ; make friends who will encourage you, challenge you, and hold you accountable; become a better, stronger, happier person. It's so much more than a Sunday evening gathering!



Turning Down the Gas

A big challenge in caring for creation is reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions. Methane is a powerful greenhouse gas that often leaks into the atmosphere. It is a significant contributor to global warming. Sources include oil and gas mining, landfills, agriculture and even leaks in the pipes that bring natural gas (methane) into our homes for fuel. When natural gas is burned for fuel it creates CO2, which is also a GHG. In our homes, it can create air quality issues as well.

Electrification of space and water heating, as well as cooking appliances, is an enormous opportunity to cut greenhouse gas pollution and save money on energy bills. Electric heat pumps heat homes and water far more efficiently than fossil-fuel appliances. Induction stoves and cooktops are also more energy efficient than their gas counterparts. Where possible, as your natural gas-powered appliances reach the end of their life, investigate converting to newer electric appliances for a more sustainable future. 

Gospel Meditation

January 14, 2024–2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a priest, I'm amazed how happily married couples remember the tiniest details of their earliest encounters. They effortlessly report things like: "he wore a blue shirt," "we ordered brussels sprouts," "her hair was up in a bun," and "he spilled shrimp cocktail sauce at my family's open front door when it was ten degrees below zero," (that one's courtesy of my mom). We delight in remembering and speaking of when our new life of love began. The little details are glorious reminders that it's all real.

It's similar for John the Apostle. He tells us of the two disciples who followed Jesus into his house, "...they stayed with him that day. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon." Why does that tiny detail matter? Because that's the time of day when they encountered the love of Jesus the Messiah in their lives. Our religion is not primarily about abstract truths about God, no matter how true or sublime. It is about God meeting and saving us in our human nature. It's about a human relationship.

What was the time of day when you first recall encountering Christ and his Church? Who was there? What did you feel? How did things look and smell? What happened? Take some time to recall it in detail. For me, it was inside an old, rickety church on a hillside in Jerome, Arizona. It was about 9 p. m. on a Saturday evening. PRACTICING CATHOLIC- RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Those Who Seek-By Colleen Jurkiewicz Dorman

In my work as a freelance writer, I have a regular column in the archdiocesan paper writing profiles of ordinary people in the local church. Laity, religious, and clergy alike — I hound them all to give me an interview, and when I do, the answer is almost always this: "You don't want to talk to me. There's nothing special about me."

I always try to convince them that there is something remarkable about everyone who is searching for the truth. It is easy to think we are not made for holiness because we are ordinary people with ordinary habits, ordinary abilities, and ordinary sins. It is easy (and very convenient) to designate holiness as something belonging to Better People. People like the saints. People like the Disciples.

The Bible gives us next to no personal information about the disciples. There is no archdiocesan newspaper profile on Andrew and Simon that can give us insight into who they were before they became St. Andrew, Inaugural Disciple and Announcer of the Messiah, and St. Peter, First Pope and the Rock-Upon-Which-Christ-Built-His-Church.

Yet I find myself insatiably curious about it. What was their childhood like? What games did they play with each other as the sun set, before their mother called them into bed? What did they think of as they fell asleep at night? What secret jokes did they share to make each other laugh? What were they afraid of? What did they hope for? Who did they want to be?

Before they were towering figures of salvation history, Simon and Andrew were just two men searching for the truth. When they looked at Christ, there was something that made it click. Perhaps they themselves could not identify what it was, but their hearts whispered it nonetheless: There it is. We finally found it.

Isn't that the best we can all hope for?

"Jesus turned and saw them following him and said to them, What are you looking for?"" — John 1:38



EUCHARISTIC MIRACLE OF CANOSIO, ITALY 1630

Canosio is a small village in the region of Val Maira, in the Diocese of Saluzzo. In 1630, its townspeople had grown cold in their religious observance due to the spread of the Calvinistic heresy. A day after the feast of Corpus Christi, the river at Maira flooded because of a torrential rainfall. The flood waters were so violent and powerful that some massive stones were dislodged from the mountain and threat ened to destroy the valley and the village itself! Father Antonio Reinardi , the pastor of the town, assembled the townspeople with the ringing of the church bells and exhorted them to pray that the Lord would stop the flood. He vowed that if the village of Canosio were spared from the flood's destruction, the townspeople would celebrate in perpetuity an annual feast of Corpus Christi. Father Reinardi then placed the Sacrament in the monstrance. He processed towards the raging flood with some of the faithful as they all recited the "Miserere" Psalm 51. After he blessed the raging waters, the rain stopped at once and the flood waters peaked and returned to their normal level. This incident revived the faith of the townspeople of Canosio and to this day they observe the vow that was made. Unfortunately, many of the documents which attest to the miracle and which were preserved in the parish archives from the 17th century were burned during the war between France and Spain. What is extant, however, is a copy describing the events and which was left by the pastor who was a witness to what occurred.

Thoughts on the Journey 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, January 14th, 2024 John 1:35-42 Suanne Gettings

My friend Pam and I heard about the retreat through other leading me to see. friends and thought it would be fun because it was open to junior and senior females AND males. Truth be known, if boys weren't part of the event, we probably wouldn't have given it a second thought. A weekend retreat with guys when we both attended all-girl Catholic schools?! Of course we were going!

The retreat weekend was called TEC which stood for Teens The two disciples heard what he said and followed Jesus. Encounter Christ. When we were filling out our registration forms and turning in our money, neither one of us boy-crazy girls were thinking about an encounter with Christ. Instead, we were quite excited about encounters of a different kind. If it was an opportunity to meet some new boys, we were willing to suffer through a weekend retreat to accomplish that objective. Our conversations for the three weeks leading up to the event centered around hair, clothes, make-up, and teenage what-if scenarios that heightened our excitement.

It was time for the TEC retreat. We arrived at the mansion on the Crosley Estate in Cincinnati at 6:30 p.m. with suitcases and sleeping bags in hand. There was the usual hustle and bustle as young people scrambled to check in and receive their instructions. Almost immediately, I noticed a young man in a brown Franciscan habit complete with a rope around his waist and a pair of sandals on his feet. He greeted us warmly as we entered and he introduced himself as Father Richard. I particularly remember his eye contact with each person and the warmth of his embrace that made me fell like I was his best friend. After we settled our things, we gathered for praise and worship followed by an evening social. Fires were crackling in the big stone fireplaces throughout the house which made the walls glow with an inviting aura. For some reason I couldn't explain, it felt so good to be with these people I didn't know and I began to feel a shift in my focus of the 'why' I was there.

In the morning, after we were served a delicious breakfast by the retreat team, we had our first morning conference.

In John's gospel, John the Baptist was standing with two of his followers. Jesus was approaching and as they watched Jesus walk by, John said to his disciples:

"BEHOLD, THE LAMB OF GOD."

Jesus then turned to them and asked,

"WHAT ARE YOU LOOKING FOR?"

They responded that they wanted to know where he was staying so Jesus invited them to come and see. Andrew, one of the followers, then went to get his brother Simon to take him to Jesus saying, "We have found the Messiah," which is translated Christ. Then he brought him to Jesus.

It's interesting to ponder the countless possibilities of how, when, why, and what circumstances people have been led to Christ over the ages. Our gospel tells of John the Baptist who led his followers to Jesus. Andrew led his brother Simon. Eventually Simon became Peter and led thousands to Jesus. Scripture and history is filled with many accounts of ordinary people who have been led to Christ by other ordinary people. Lives are changed in an extraordinary way, not by the people who led them, but by the Holy Spirit who dwells within them.

Each one of us has a story to tell. We're all part of the continuum of salvation history. Sometimes we are caught off-quard by an encounter we didn't expect, like my retreat experience in high school. God allows people and events to re-direct us and transform us. With transformation and conversion comes the responsibility to do our part in bringing people to Christ and helping to build the Kingdom of God. But, we need to be willing vessels of the Holy Spirit who calls us to continue the journey of conversion in our lives and commit to a deeper union with the Father. Trust that the Lord will give you everyone and the Spirit lead you so that you can lead others.

The all important question that Jesus asked the disciples in John's gospel was, "What are you looking for?" Most of us are looking for love, happiness, and peace, all of which can be found in Christ Jesus. Seek Him!

What is ParishStaq?

ParishStaq is Church of the Resurrection's digital hub for parish information, registration, updates, and financial giving. It's a dynamic Catholic Church management system that is integrated with our giving software, PushPay. ParishStaq is a broad database that provides secure, up-to-date information on your family's contact information, financial giving, event registrations, and more.

Why do I need to enroll?

Besides the secure access to your personal data and the ability to view information about activities, group events, user-specific calendars, your personal giving and registration forms, we use this new system to regularly communicate what's happening with our ministries and in our church.

But don't worry about communication overload. With ParishStaq, YOU control how much news you get and how much interaction with others that you have in your ministries and in our parish community. Your personal portal can be customized to your preferences and updated by you.

Why does each adult in the family need to sign up separately?

One of the benefits of ParishStaq is that it allows for customizable access to the ministries, calendars, and signups each member cares about the most. In the case of a married couple, the husband may want information and activities such as Men's Ministry, while his wife may want to sign up for Walking with Purpose. By giving each individual his or her own access, the system allows for a more personalized digital hub.

Family members are also grouped together and linked in a household. This comes in handy with the events tab where a family calendar of events can be found.


