
HOW TO PUT OUR PARISH IN YOUR WILL :

After providing for your families and loved ones, parishioners may want to include the Parish in your wills, thus helping to assure the long-term future of the Parish and the work that must continue in generations to come. Bequests are free of estate tax and can substantially reduce the amount of your assets claimed by the government. You can give needed support to either of our Parishes by simply including the following words in your will: "I give, devise and bequeath to Church of the Annunciation Parish Charitable Trust in Ludlow, Vermont... or... Holy Name of Mary Parish Charitable Trust in Proctorsville, Vermont (insert amount being given here) to be used to support the ministry of the Parish".

A bequest can be a specific amount, a specific piece of property, a percentage of an estate, or all or part of the residue of an estate. You can also name the Parish as a contingency beneficiary in the event someone named in your will is no longer living. It is recommended that a lawyer help in drafting or amending a will.

From Father's Desk

This Saturday, June 20th, is the First Day of Summer. This being said, however, the month of June always seems to be an entity unto itself. We tend to get a lot of rain in June, and each year, toward the end of the month, I often hear people say something like, "Gee, we've had a lot of rain this month." I'm always happy to see the rain because it means I'll need to spend less time watering the gardens. This year, the first part of the month has been cloudy and cool, making it easy on the tender, newly-planted flowers and shrubs. But as I write this, I see that the forecast for the week ahead (June 15-22) is for more summer-like weather, with temperatures in the low 80's and perhaps some rain in the weekend. I'll be outdoors pulling weeds, which has become something of a secondary vocation.

Summer is usually "down time" in parish life, with the Religious Education program having been completed, and the more intense liturgical seasons of Lent and Eastertide behind us. Parishioners travel while Part-timers and Visitors arrive, filling the pews with both new and familiar faces. The pandemic which we've been going through, however, has brought the parish a far more serious "down time" than we've ever experienced. Parish life went invisible, so to speak. I continued to celebrate Mass privately (about 75 of them while you were waiting patiently and watching Mass on television); I continued to hear Confessions by appointment; I visited the Sick and Anointed the Dying, and celebrated three Funerals all during this otherwise quiet time while the church building remained unlocked for personal prayer.

And now we're back... mostly. On our first weekend together there were 61 people in attendance. They made a mighty effort, singing through their masks so that I could hear them quite well up in the Sanctuary. Last weekend attendance increased by 50%, meaning that there were 92 people dispersed among the three Masses. Hopefully, the number attending will continue to increase, which will strengthen our parish and our sense of togetherness in Christ.

Some spoke of having an outdoor Coffee Hour following the early Mass, which I heartily endorse. It will mean more work in setting up and putting away, but enjoying some fellowship *en plain air* will bring a new feeling to our community. I will speak to some people to see if this sounds do-able, and how we might plan for inclement weather among other challenges. Any desire for Coffee after the later Mass? Let me know.

It is apparent that a number of parishioners who are in the "vulnerable" category have not yet returned, which is understandable. As you notice regular attendees missing the Mass and Sacraments, let me know who and how they are, and I will put together a plan for getting Holy Communion to them. In the mean time, it would be a good thing to continue calling friends and neighbors who are having difficulty getting out. Our sense of parish begins with the Mass, whose Holy Communion is "the source and summit of our Catholic faith." (from the Documents of Vatican II) Fellowship is a fruit of our worship, not the reason for our gathering. So, to become what we have celebrated and received, our Holy Communion can be extended into our communion with one another in charity. Parish life fosters works of charity, and the grace of the Holy Eucharist binds us to Christ, in Whose Name we care for one another.

So, as the languid days of Summer unfold before us, let's make it a summer of recuperation and renewal from all that separated us from one another in "corona-tide" and live our faith in togetherness and good cheer.
