A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

This week, in honor of the Winter Solstice, we look at what is arguably the most important artist at St. Augustine: the

sun. Everyday, the sun fires the windows, the colors changing as it moves across the sky, shifting with the clouds. In the words of the stained glass artist, Burnham, the windows are "enhanced and glorified by the light of heaven."

Jesus was born just after the winter solstice, December 21, which in the Northern hemisphere is when the sun is at the lowest point in the sky and the days are shortest. Theologically, the increasing days from this date represents coming of Christ's salvific work into the world. Traditionally, the sun plays an important role in church architecture. Church altars are supposed to face east, towards the rising sun and the Resurrection, which is the case at St. Augustine.



At the winter solstice, the sun sets between the two hills in the west where Route 12 heads toward Northfield, shining directly on the front of St. Augustine Church.



The light blazes a path through the doors down the center aisle and, as seen in the photo, the light streams through the Angel window in the choir loft, bathing the sanctuary in color.



At the same time, St. Augustine cemetery marks the solstice. The sun sets directly between the front gate. I haven't found if this is intentional or not, but it may be based on a Catholic tradition that I am not aware of. I'll keep looking and maybe next December I'll have an update.
