

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

On Thursday June 29th, the Church celebrated the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul, who are depicted on the left window in the sanctuary at St. Augustine Church. Tradition holds that both were martyred in Rome. We examined Peter during the Easter Season. The keys represent the authority given to him by Christ to serve as His vicar over the Church. His cross memorializes how Peter asked to be crucified upside down as he was unworthy to imitate Christ's crucifixion.



Paul's symbol is a bible (he wrote the most books in the New Testament) and sword, which has two meanings. Scripture portrays God's word as a sword. The book reads "Spiritus Gladius," or the Sword of the Spirit from Ephesians 6:17. The Book of Hebrews, traditionally attributed to Paul, says "Indeed, the word of God is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword, penetrating even between soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to discern reflections and thoughts of the heart" (4:12).

Paul holds a sword because that was how he was martyred. He was a Roman citizen and protected from execution involving torture.
