Padre Pio Relics

St. Monica Parish will host a day of prayer with the relics of St. Padre Pio on Friday, July 14. The relics will be displayed in the sanctuary after the 7:00AM Mass. At 6:30PM, a closing prayer service will take place, during which Evening Prayer will be prayed. Around noon, the Rosay will be prayed. A kneeler will be set near the relics to allow for personal prayer. Religious articles, including those of Padre Pio will be available for purchase.

Archbishop Coyne Update

Archbishop Coyne will remain in the Diocese of Burlington until October 8. Now acting as our Administrator, Archbishop Coyne will not specifically be named in the Eucharistic Prayer during mass. The Consulters, a small group of Diocesan priests, have elected Msgr. John McDermott to become Administrator after Archbishop Coyne leaves, and before a new Bishop of Burlington is named. During this time, known as the interregnum, parish and school life will continue as normal. The only difference is that no major projects or programs will be started.

Please pray everyday that a new Bishop will be appointed to the Diocese of Burlington who will be holy and wise.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Lilies are an important in Catholic art and are used to symbolize purity. They are found three places in the windows, all in the right front corner of St. Augustine Church: behind Mary in the Annunciation, held by St. Anthony of Padua in the small hallway, and alone above the Annunciation, pictured here.

This week we use the three lilies to honor the saint we celebrate on Friday July 14th: St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680).

St. Kateri Tekakwitha (1656-1680). Interred at St. Francis Xavier Church in

Kahnawke, Quebec, the Mohawk Reserve across the river from Montreal, Kateri is the saint geographically closest to St. Augustine Church (just beating out St. Andre Bessette at St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal). She is called "Lily of the Mohawks" and is the patroness of ecology. Details of her fascinating life and faith can be found here, including her journey that took her through Vermont:
