## A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

This week's Gospel reading is a great entry into the uniqueness of John's Gospel as only John has the detail that it was Andrew who led his brother Peter to Christ. The human mind best remembers abstract ideas or long stories by pairing them to specific images and objects. We'll do this with the windows to learn the some of the important characteristics of John's Gospel.

St. John begins his Gospel with the big picture—"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God" (Jn 1:1)—and soars at this high level throughout, like the eagle below John in the north transept.

John organizes his Gospel around seven signs, like the seven stars around the Christ the King window above John. The first is the turning of water into wine at the Feast of Cana, which is portrayed in the back left of the church.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus makes seven "I am" statements, such as "I AM the true vine" (15:1), which evokes God's declaration to Moses "I AM WHO AM" (Ex 3:14). As we saw in the 5/7 bulletin, that is why grapevines make up the backdrop of the windows.

Only John has the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead.

Only John has the story of Jesus washing the Apostles feet. We don't have an image of that but can remember it with the Baptism of the Lord window, where Jesus stands in the water.

In the Gospel of John Jesus gives us the new commandment "As I have loved you, so you also should love one another" (Jn 13:34), represented by the Sacred Heart below St. Augustine.

John has more stories of Jesus appearing after his Resurrection, such as to Thomas and while the Apostles are fishing, seen in the three fish in the front left of the church.
