### The Presentation of the Lord/Candlemas

On Friday, February 2, the Catholic Church celebrates the day Mary and Joseph brought baby Jesus to the Temple to offer a thanksgiving sacrifice. It was the day Simeon and Anna saw Jesus and talked about him. Simeon called Jesus a "light to the nations." It is customary on this day to bring candles to church to be blessed. These blessed candles are brought home, reminding the faithful that the light of Christ is present in their homes.

Our parish masses will be at 7:00AM at St. Monica, and 8:15AM at St. Augustine.

### Feast of St. Blaise

Since the feast of St. Blaise falls on a Saturday this year, February 3, the blessing of throats will be done as part of the weekend masses over all of the congregation at once. This blessing recalls the miracle brought about through the intercession of St. Blaise, which saved the life of a young boy choking on a fish bone.

In the Gospel reading today (Mk 1:21-28), Jesus enters a synagogue to teach. This is a perfect time to look at the Father's Hand window in the top left of the sanctuary. A hand is an important Jewish way of portraying God's action in art as Jewish tradition does not allow the depiction of God as a person.

A great example of God's Hand in Jewish art is in a



fresco found in the Dura-Europos synagogue in Syria, dated about 244. Moses leads the Israelites across the Red Sea with the Egyptian troops in pursuit. Above, God's hands are stretched out, evoking Deuteronomy 11:2-3: "his strong hand and outstretched arm; the signs and deeds he wrought in the midst of

Egypt, on Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and on all his land."
