A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Weds. December 27 is the Feast of Saint John, Apostle and evangelist. St John is found in the north transept with the other four Gospel writers. He also appears five other times in the windows and can be easily found as he is the only one of the twelve Apostles without a beard.

In the 8/20 bulletin we saw that after the crucifixion, John took Mary into his household. She moved with John to Ephesus, where she was assumed into heaven.

John wrote three Epistles, the Book of Revelation, and a Gospel (which we'll learn about next week in part 2).

John is the brother of the Apostle James, the longest living Apostle and the only one not to forsake Jesus at the crucifixion and not to be martyred. Not that it wasn't tried, which his window teaches with a green winged snake emerging from the chalice John holds. Legend has it that John was given a chalice of poisoned wine to drink. The poison floated out of the chalice in the form of a green snake, and John was unharmed. In the past, people brought wine or cider to Mass on John's feast day to be blessed.

St. John died in Ephesus in 98 A.D and is the patron of love, loyalty, friendships, and authors.
