Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception

Monday, December 8 is a Holy Day of Obligation for all Catholics. The 4:15pm Mass on Sunday, December 7 will use the readings and prayers of the 2nd Sunday of Advent. The Immaculate Conception Masses are 8:15am St. Monica (school Mass), 12:10pm at St. Augustine, and 5:00pm at St. Monica.

Altar of Remembrance

During the month of November there will be a book located in the sanctuary of the church where parishioners can write the names of deceased loved ones. There will be a prayer added during the intentions for those written in the book.

The names sent to the office for All Souls Intentions will be included in Masses throughout the year. One Mass per week in November and one Mass per month until next November, will be offered up for our parish All Souls Intentions. Having a Mass offered for a loved one is a great act of faith and kindness. The All Souls envelopes will be placed on the side altar with the Book of Remembrance.

ATTENTION ALL CONFIRMATION STUDENTS

All our young people who are preparing for Confirmation this April are expected to attend the Diocese of Burlington Confirmation Pilgrimage on Saturday, January 17, 2026 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. This is a self-transport event, so parents will need to arrange arrival and departure from the Cathedral at 29 Allen St., Burlington VT. The event goes from 10am through the Cathedrals Vigil Mass, which usually ends at 5pm: please be punctual. The parish will cover the cost of all student participants, but if a parent who wishes to come and stay for the retreat will need to pay a \$15 cover charge for food and materials.


1st Quarter Financial Report

Let us pray that those who are struggling with suicidal thoughts might find the support, care, and love they need in their community, and be open to the beauty of life.


Friday November 21 is the Memorial of the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Presentation of Jesus is well-known to most of us, given that its recorded in the Gospel of Luke and is one of the Joyful Mysteries of the Rosary. Holy Tradition also holds that the Virgin Mary was presented to the Temple in Jerusalem as a young girl. Much like Sts. Elizabeth and Zachariah, Mary's parents Sts. Anne and Joachim were older and childless. God heard their prayers and Anne conceived. At age three Mary was offered to the Temple, where she lived until she was about 15 years old, being educated in Scripture and assisting in Temple duties.

The image of St. Anne and the Virgin Mary, found in the front right of St. Augustine Church, evokes the imagery of the Presentation. Images of the Presentation of Jesus often have a book and scroll in them, representing the Word of God and Law. For this reason, Anne holds a book and Mary holds a scroll, portraying her education in the Temple. Around them are gates and towers of the Temple building. In most painting and icons, the high priest with his ephod of twelve jewels appears, such as in our image of The Presentation of Jesus.

And we can't forget about the statue of St. Anne and the Blessed Virgin Mary in the southern transept, which mirrors the image in the windows. See bulletin 9/3/23 for more detail about its history.
