A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

This week Pope Leo will travel to Turkey and Lebanon on the first Apostolic Journey of his papacy. This is to commemorate the 1700th anniversary of the First Council of Nicea, when there was no ecclesial separation between the Eastern and Western Churches. In honor of this, we'll look at the Eastern Orthodox-style icon of St. Augustine, which is above the tabernacle at St. Augustine Church.



Thank you to Loretta Schneider, who provided the historical context. The icon was commissioned in the early 2000s by Fr. Thomas Mosher. It was paid for by Sr. Barbara Gregoire, her brother Ernest, and his wife Leona, which is memorialized on this plaque on the confessional on the right as you enter the church. The fact that an icon is displayed so prominently at St. Augustine Church is a visible sign of the unity that we desire for our Orthodox siblings and encouragement to work towards that here in Vermont.

St. Jacob of Alaska is a small Orthodox Church in Northfield Falls. As a way of praying with Pope Leo and the whole Church during his Apostolic Journey, a group of us will be attending St. Jacob's Vespers service at 6:00 PM Saturday 11/29. This will coincide many important events that day in Turkey: "In the afternoon, [Pope Leo] will take part in a Doxology at the Patriarchal Church of Saint George, the seat of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of Constantinople. Following the service, Pope Leo XIV will meet with Ecumenical Patriarch Bartholomew I, with the two leaders signing a Joint Declaration in the Patriarchal Palace. The day will conclude with Holy Mass celebrated in Istanbul's Volkswagen Arena." <https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2025-10/schedule-for-pope-leo-s-first-international-journey.html>
