

ATTENTION ALL CONFIRMATION STUDENTS

All our young people who are preparing for Confirmation this April are expected to attend the Diocese of Burlington Confirmation Pilgrimage on Saturday, January 17, 2026 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. This is a self-transport event, so parents will need to arrange arrival and departure from the Cathedral at 29 Allen St., Burlington VT. The event goes from 10am through the Cathedrals Vigil Mass, which usually ends at 5pm: please be punctual. The parish will cover the cost of all student participants, but if a parents who wish to come and stay for the retreat will need to pay a \$15 cover charge for food and materials.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Last week we saw how Msgr. William Crosby was not only the longest serving pastor in the history of St. Augustine but also a prominent leader in Montpelier. So well loved, in fact, that a few months after he died in April 1963, the street he had lived on took his name. The *Barre Times Argus* reported August 15, 1963 that on September 1 Fullerton Avenue would be officially changed to Msgr. Crosby Avenue. The project was taken up "as the result of several requests from residents who believed such action would be in keeping as a memorial to the late pastor." Mayor Manuel Canas wrote to every resident and encouraged them to attend the meeting if there was any opposition. Three residents attended to approve the change. Canas reported he received one letter in opposition "But since the person writing the letter did not have the guts to sign his or her name, I don't think the letter has any bearing on our action."

Manuel Canas was a longtime parishioner of St. Augustine Church. He was born in 1930, making him only 33 when he was mayor. Manuel passed away in 2013, but his wife Dorothy Canas, is still a leader in the St. Augustine Community. When I asked her about the name change of the street she said, "I remember that my husband and Msgr. Crosby were close. My husband thought renaming the street to Msgr. Crosby's name would honor his contribution to St. Augustine's and the Montpelier community." As a result, Msgr. Crosby lives on not only in the church he helped grow, in his grave next to the church, but also in the streets of our community.
