Be the Light This Advent Season

“The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.” — John 1:5

As we enter the sacred season of Advent — a time of waiting, hope, and renewal — we are reminded of the light Christ brings into our lives. At Vermont Catholic Charities, we strive to reflect that light by offering hope and compassion to our neighbors in need.

This Advent, we invite you to Be the Light. Through our Annual Advent Appeal, your generosity can shine brightly in the lives of individuals and families facing difficult times. Each gift is a reflection of Christ's love — a beacon of hope to those walking through dark valleys.

Every day, your compassion allows us to respond to urgent needs. Here are just a few stories of lives changed through your support:

A Story of Courage — Jennifer, a single mother, and her son with special needs found themselves in a rural Vermont motel, fleeing an abusive situation with barely more than the clothes on their backs. With limited food, clothing, and personal items, Jennifer reached out in desperation. We responded with a food

card and a VISA card to help cover essential needs. “I didn’t know where to go,” she said. “You gave me hope when I had none.”

A Story of Light in the Darkness — Mike and Julie, parents of two young children, work full-time and are proud to provide for their family. When Julie’s hours were cut, they fell behind on bills and faced a utility disconnect notice. We stepped in to help. “Your kindness paved a path to security and peace,” they told us.

A Story of Warmth in the Cold — Patsy and Tom are hardworking parents of three children. Both hold full-time jobs and were managing to make ends meet — until an unexpected car repair threw their budget off balance. Suddenly, they found themselves without heating fuel, facing cold nights and no hot water. We responded with a fuel delivery to restore warmth and comfort to their home. They stated, “Your help meant the world to us — thank you from the bottom of our hearts.”

These moments of mercy are only possible because of you.

Last Christmas, your gifts brought relief, dignity, and joy to 564 adults and 546 children throughout Vermont. Your support of our Emergency Aid Program has helped hundreds of families throughout the year with food, housing, utilities, and other essential needs.

This year, we’ve seen a rising number of Vermonters seeking help — many for the first time — due to inflation, reduced work hours, and unexpected hardships. Too many hardworking families now live one setback away from crisis.

What makes our Emergency Aid Program unique is our compassionate, flexible approach. We do not enforce strict income thresholds. Instead, we respond to real-life emergencies — car repairs, medical needs, job loss, or caregiving duties — that push families into crisis.

We believe strong communities begin with secure families — families who are warm, housed, and nourished. With your help, we can continue to ensure that no one faces darkness alone.


