

Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Saturday 5/31/25 is the Feast of the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin Mary. The image is found in the front right of St. Augustine Church. We looked at the Visitation 5/26/24. I reported then that I didn't know what I would write, and then ended up with more content then I could use. Since then, it's continued to grow on me, how the details come together to portray multiple levels of meaning.

To summarize last year:

- +Mary's left arm is also raised, which is common in images of the Visitation. This emphasizes Mary's more prominent role in Salvation History.
- +Mary's and Elizabeth's arms form a circle or triangle. This creates a kind of circular energy that enacts the dynamism of their encounter.
- +In the arms and the pillars, this image of the Visitation emphasizes the Trinity. The circularity of the arms mirrors the image of the Trinity portrayed in the three fish, seen almost directly across the church. The three columns that frame Mary and Elizabeth also invoke the Trinity and provide the image a sense of symmetry and stability.
- +The power of human connection is at the center of the Visitation. The story is so familiar to us that we sometimes miss the uncertainty and fear that Mary and Elizabeth undoubtedly felt at times. The cousins meet in the context of unprecedented vocations and the unknown of their first pregnancies. In this first moment of sight and touch, Burnham captures the spark of mutual support and the fire of their faith that sustained them through the ups and downs of their callings.

There's one more detail that I didn't notice last year that ties the whole image together: the arches at the top of the pillars join with bottom "V" of the arms to make a heart, framing and infusing the Visitation with love of the Holy Trinity. May that love continue to grow in the St. Augustine Church and parish community.
