

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows


Today we look at the Triple Crown under St. Gregory the Great in the southern transept. According to the Vatican website, the Triregnum, or Papal Tiara, symbolizes "the triple power of the Pope: father of kings, governor of the world and Vicar of Christ" and has different meanings, such as "the militant, the suffering and the triumphant Church." It developed over time, taking final form in 1314.

In our window, the Triregnum is surrounded by small blue flowers. I have not been able to find any connection of flowers with the Triregnum or St. Gregory the Great. Perhaps it is just a flourish that

Burnham added for artistic reasons. To me they look like forget-me-nots, which bloomed in Vermont a couple weeks ago, and are sometimes called "the eyes of Mary." Either way, they are one of the hundreds of small details that decorate the windows of St. Augustine Church and add to the color of our worship.
