

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

In our 4/13/25 we looked at our altar. After the Tabernacle, which houses the Eucharist, the altar is the holiest place in the church. It is not only where the bread and wine become Christ, the altar also represents Christ. There is even a saying "The altar is Christ." Through the consecration the altar becomes what Louis Tofari calls a kind of "living stone."

There's also a way that our windows contribute to our altar's "life." When I visited the uncovered altar during Holy Week, I noticed the windows reflecting in the polished granite. In the first photo the altar reflects the bible and sword under St. Paul and the upside down cross and keys under St. Peter. In the second, the Nativity is most prominent. I only noticed this today, a couple months after taking the photo, the convergence of the four posted bed on the altar. It gives new meaning to the open question of why Mary and Baby Jesus are on a four posted bed. Whether intentional or not, the Nativity image in the windows evokes an altar and the sacrifice that He will one day make on the cross. And the living light of the sun shines it on to the altar, creating another often unseen strand in the living web of faith at St. Augustine Church.
