A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Since the installation of St. Augustine's stained glass windows in 1938, the sun has made 87 annual cycles around our church.

The time of the summer solstice brings out unique details in the windows. The sun sets in the northwest, about where Jesus dies on the cross in the front left of the church.

The windows on the north side of the church fully shine only in these couple months, as seen in the second photo from the evening before the solstice. The images of Saint Peter and Saint Paul frame the statue of the Blessed Mother.

Only this time of year do the windows in the sanctuary fully light up in the morning, taken the morning after the solstice.

The Church marks this season with the Solemnity of the Nativity of St. John the Baptist on June 24, who said of Christ "He must increase, but I must decrease" (John 3:30).

As the days pass, the sun gradually retreats to its setting directly in front of the doors of St. Augustine Church on the winter solstice. We celebrate the birth of Christ, and the sun begins increasing once again.







Greetings in Christ:

I am a long-time parishioner at St. Augustine's in Montpelier. I am reaching out regarding an interest I have in engaging in a pilgrimage during this Jubilee Year with its destination the Cathedral in Burlington. My intention is to make this a walking pilgrimage from St. Augustine's Church in Montpelier over a three day period. Although I began this intention with a solo journey in mind, I am now curious to see if there are others who may want to join it.

My plan at this point is to do the walk in three days, the first day from Montpelier to Waterbury, the second from Waterbury to Richmond, and the final day from Richmond to Burlington. For planning purposes, I'm targeting Thursday, September 18 through Saturday September 20. The goal would be to arrive at St. Joseph's in time for the Vigil Mass in the afternoon Saturday. Although some walking on main routes may be necessary, I'm looking to utilize many of the segments of the Cross-Vermont Trail, which often follows less-traveled roads or bike paths. Joining along the route could be an option for those not up for the full journey.

I'm reaching out with three requests. The first would be suggestions about how to connect with parishioners along the route about interest in joining the pilgrimage. The second would be how I might inquire about families who might be willing to host a pilgrim for a night on Thursday or Friday in Waterbury or Richmond, or those who might be able to assist pilgrims with a return ride from Burlington. (I looked into bus options, but alas, it doesn't seem like there are any running Saturday evening.) Alternative suggestions for basic lodging are also welcome. The third would be information about any options for access to the churches in Montpelier, Waterbury, and Richmond for individual or group prayer in the morning before setting out on each day's journey.

Any help, advice, or prayers you can offer would be greatly appreciated. Perhaps this is an opportunity to journey in faith together for a few days.
