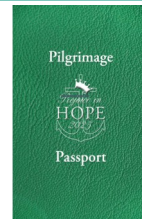


Jubilee Pilgrimage Passport

Let us pray that each one of us might find consolation in a personal relationship with Jesus, and from his Heart, learn to have compassion on the world.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Friday June 8 is the Memorial of Saint Anthony of Padua, Priest and Doctor of the Church. His window is found in a small exit hallway in the front right of the St. Augustine Church now used for storage. We looked at the image and its history in the 6/9/24 bulletin.

St. Augustine novelist Mari Tomasi (1907-1965) refers to St. Anthony in *Deep Grow the Roots*. Luigi, the main character has two unexpected visitors, one of whom is the girl he is courting. They are going to stay for dinner and he only has two sets of dishes. Luigi sends his friend out the window to get some more from his neighbor:

"Dio," he whispered hoarsely, "do you want them to think Luigi Sentinelli is one of Sant' Antonio's beggars? Here, out the window! And make sure to come back the same way."

Tomasi explains her reference to St. Anthony of Padua in a footnote: "Every Tuesday morning in front of the Franciscan Church of St. Anthony in Rome, four loaves of bread are distributed by the Friars to each of six hundred women, and on Fridays to two hundred men. This practice originated in Padua a few years after the death of St. Anthony."

I wasn't able to find details about this practice at St. Anthony Church in Rome, but St. Anthony's Bread is widespread and did find its origin story. In 1263 a young child drowned near the Basilica of St. Anthony in Padua. His mother prayed to St. Anthony for his healing, promising in return to give the boy's weight in grain to the poor. The boy was healed the tradition of giving bread in St. Anthony's name was born.
