# **BISHOP'S APPEAL**

Our parishes are doing well so far! Thank you to everyone who has been able to respond already, either dropping your envelope in the collection basket or mailing it to the chancery. If you are not able to give this year, responding is still important so that you will not receive any more mailings. Bishop McDermott has pledged to use these donations to maintain our diocesan programs for Religious Education, Catholic Schools, annulments and Catholic Charities.

# St. Augustine/St. Monica Update

Due to the reorganization process that the Diocese is going through, Bishop McDermott has told Fr. Pat that the possibility of uniting our two parishes into one will be put on hold until the situation is resolved. In the meantime, Fr. Pat has been authorized to bring the administration of the two communities together. Also, based on the number of priests and the mass attendance numbers during this past May, the Bishop has asked parishes to reduce the number of masses. Having two priests serving our parishes, the Bishop has also asked Fr. Pat to make sure one priest can celebrate all weekend masses. One of our priests should be available to cover masses at another parish in case of illness or vacation.

Also following are other changes:

Daniel Lacourrege is the new Religious Education Coordinator for both St. Monica and St. Augustine. He will be coordinating the classes, meeting with teachers, and communicating with parents.

Elizabeth Ehlers will be our new Finance Director for St. Monica Parish, St. Augustine Parish and St. Monica-St. Michael School. Elizabeth has been working with parishes in the Diocese and brings lots of experience.

Parish groups will start to meet together. St. Augustine Parish and St. Monica Parish Liturgy Committees and Parish Councils will begin meeting together each month. After two years of experience, Fr. Pat realizes that because of overlapping events, meeting together makes sense. The Finance Councils will continue to meet separately.

# The St. Augustine Rectory

Because of a broken hot water heater that is not fixable, there is no hot water currently in the rectory bathrooms. No one is able to live there. The St. Augustine Parish Council and Finance Council have both recommended to Fr. Pat that the rectory be sold. There is currently a proposal to tear down the breezeway between the church and the rectory. The proceeds from the sale of the rectory will allow for the replacement of the St. Augustine Church carpet and the creation of a fund for the St. Augustine Cemetery maintenance. We are currently waiting for a surveyor to determine the exact boundary line between the rectory and the church property.

# **Parish Committees Meeting**

Wednesday, August 6, Fr. Pat would like to meet with the parish councils, finance councils, liturgy committees, leaders of the Knights of Columbus and Catholic Daughters, Buildings and Grounds and Hospitality from both St. Augustine and St. Monica. The meeting will be at 6:00pm at St. Augustine Parish Hall. The goal of this meeting will be to discuss the topics above, changing in mass schedules, selling the rectory and bringing the administration of the parishes closer together.

# **Diocesan Convocation: Friday, July 18**

The Vermont Jubilee of Hope Convocation will be at St. Monica Church on Friday, July 18 from 5:00pm to 8:00pm. The theme for the evening is *Witnesses to Hope: Sharing Our Stories Through the Generations*. There will be a potluck—so bring a dish! There will be inspiring presentations to deepen our faith, a time to celebrate the sacrament of Penance, time for prayer and worship, and one may obtain a plenary Jubilee indulgence.

# A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows



Last week we looked at the episcopal gloves worn by the Four Doctors in the southern transept. We continue this theme by looking at their shoes. They are called "pontifical sandals" and go back to at least the fifth century. Despite the name, they usually look more like slippers. Pontifical sandals, like priestly vestments in general, are likely modelled on Roman senatorial garb, yet with an added Christian meaning drawn from Romans 10:15: "And how can people preach unless they are sent? As it is written, "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring [the] good news!"

Over time, only higher prelates were allowed to use pontifical sandals and only during a Solemn Pontifical Mass. Like with the gloves, putting on the sandals is a ceremonial act and during the vesting rite the prelate prays:

Ad Caligas: Calcea, Domine, pedes meos in praeparationem evangelii pacis, et protege me in velamento alarum tuarum. "Shod my feet, Lord, unto the preparation of the gospel of peace, and protect me under the cover of thy wings."

Sandals typically follow the liturgical color of the vestments. Three of the Doctors wear read sandals. Which one is the only one wearing green?


Finally, a couple quiz questions:
