Parish Committees Meeting

Wednesday, August 6, Fr. The goal of this meeting will be to discuss the topics above, changing in mass schedules, selling the rectory and bringing the administration of the parishes closer together.

Plan Ahead: Our Parish Feast Day

On Sunday, August 24 from noon to 2:30pm, our parishes will celebrate the Feast of St. Monica (Aug 27) and St. Augustine (Aug 28), together, at the Barre Town Recreation Area. Finance News

On July 1 the Diocese and all of our parishes and schools marked the beginning of a new fiscal year. Our bookkeepers are looking at bank statements and investment reports right now, preparing year-end reports. These will be reviewed by the Finance Councils and School Board. Suggestions will be made to Fr. Pat based on these reviews as we move into the new fiscal year. A report will be shared with the parishes and school community when finished.

St. Monica-St. Michael School Enrollment and News

Despite the installation of many air exchanges throughout the school building, which has closed down entrance to the building to most people, Principal Mike Alford has continued to meet with new families interested in the school for their children. Enrollment is currently at 147 students, with 4 grades filled up or near full. Any parish family thinking about enrolling a student, should contact the school to set up a meeting with the principal.

On August 6, Principal Alford and Fr. Pat will host the Diocesan Superintendent of Schools and all of the principals of Catholic Schools throughout the Diocese, at St. Monica Church. This in-service will offer the principals a chance to encourage and support each other as they reflect on the unique ministry of leading their school spiritually as well as academically.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows



This Sunday, the Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, we look at the symbol on the front of the altar of St. Augustine Church, something that Fr. Pat explained to my faith formation class last year. The symbol looks like a P superimposed on an X. These are the Greek letters chi and rho, the first two letters of the word Christ in Greek: ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ (Christos). In this season of Ordinary Time, when the altar is partially exposed, almost all of the windows of St. Augustine Church can be seen on it, enacting Colossians 1:16-7: "all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together."
