Communications update



In July of 2009 *Vermont Catholic* magazine was established by Bishop Salvatore Matano. At that time, it replaced the *Vermont Catholic Tribune* weekly newspaper which had its beginning in 1956 and served five Vermont bishops and the faithful of Vermont for 53 years. *Vermont Catholic* ran monthly from 2009 through 2016 and then changed to a quarterly magazine in 2017 under Bishop Christopher Coyne. Starting with the Fall 2025 issue, *Vermont Catholic* will once again be redesigned.

The magazine will remain a quarterly publication, with issues released in September, December, March, and June. However, beginning this fall, the September and March issues will have 68 pages, while the December and June issues will be more specialized, containing 32 pages. These changes are necessary to conserve financial resources so that the valuable work *Vermont Catholic* does to share the Good News of Jesus Christ throughout the state can continue.

Vermont Catholic accepts sponsorships at the eighth, quarter, half, and full-page levels. We are currently seeking sponsorship commitments by October 31, 2025 to help offset the cost and increase the December issue from 32 pages to 68. You will also notice different design elements starting with the Fall issue. Our goal is to preserve the familiar layout and flow of *Vermont Catholic*, its trusted contributors, recurring elements, and meaningful stories, while embracing a fresh design that reflects this new chapter. Due to printed page limitations, some columnists you may expect to see will not be included in the magazine. However, all columnists will continue to write; featured columnists will be rotated; and all remaining articles will be published online at vermontcatholic.org/vtc.

Another necessary change is that the price of a yearly subscription will be increased from a donation of \$24 a year to the Bishop's Annual Appeal to \$40 a year. This will take effect on September 1, 2025. All donations of \$24 or more to the Bishop's Annual Appeal made before September 1, 2025, will be honored, but any donation made after that date will require a minimum of \$40 to receive the magazine mailed to your home for a year. A limited number of magazines will continue to be sent to each parish for parishioners who do not receive home delivery. All issues, including the issue archive dating back to 2009, can be viewed at any time online at vermontcatholic.org/vtc.

Vermont Catholic and the Diocese of Burlington do not take these changes lightly. We strive to produce the best magazine possible, one that will engage, inform, and inspire our readers to live out the fullness of their lives in Christ. We are a small, dedicated team, with our own editor, art director, staff writer, and diocesan contributors; the Diocese of Burlington fully produces this magazine on our own, something that is a rarity in this field.

While these changes reflect the financial realities of our time, they do not diminish our commitment to delivering a high-quality, inspiring publication rooted in our Catholic faith. We are grateful for your continued support and prayers, and it is our hope that you will continue to enjoy, engage with, and learn from every issue of *Vermont Catholic*.
