Pope's Monthly Prayer Intention

July

For Formation in Discernment

Let us pray that we might again learn how to discern, to know how to choose paths of life, and reject everything that leads us away from Christ and the Gospel.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Thursday July 31 is the Memorial of Saint Ignatius of Loyola, Priest. St. Ignatius is not portrayed in the windows of St. Augustine Church but two images in particular can help us remember his story: St. Michael in the choir loft and the unicorn, which is found in the top of the Resurrection window in the front left of the church.

Ignatius was born in Basque country of Spain 1491 and died in 1556. He was born into an aristocratic family and served as a page in the court of Castile, meaning that he was trained to be a knight. Today we tend to think of knights as virtuous heroes. Some were and the Church encouraged them to be, but in general, the culture of warrior class was much closer to that of the mafia, particularly in Spain. Ignatius relished the status and honor that came with being a knight until his leg was broken in battle by a canon ball. He wanted adventure books about knight to read while he recovered but there were none in the castle. So he read what was available: stories of the saints.



After a while, Ignatius began to see a difference. Stories about knights excited him while he read them, but after left him burned out and empty. The stories of the saints began to excite him as well, yet



he remained energetic and happy after. Ignatius began to think that if they could be holy, he could as well. When he was well enough to leave the castle in 1522, he went to the Shrine of Our Lady of Montserrat and kept an all night vigil. In the morning, he left his sword a the altar, gave away his fine clothes, and became a knight in service of God and the Church, rather than honor and riches. He went on to found the Society of Jesus, or Jesuits, in 1540, which incorporated military discipline and obedience in its rule.

A message from our Seminarian

I spent this summer studying Saints, Church architecture, and Priestly Virtues during my time in Rome. I was there for about a month which gave me a chance to deepen my faith in countless ways. I was able to visit the Catacombs of the early Christians, pray in front of the tomb of St. Paul, St. Peter, and St. Monica. I also had the chance to visit the Vatican several times where my group went to Mass near the bones of Saint Peter. Later that month my group met Pope Leo XIV after a Wednesday audience. We were blessed to speak to the Holy Father for about a minute and a half sharing what states we were all from and then receiving a blessing and taking a picture with him. Before he left, I felt one strong desire in my heart and that was to voice the needs of Vermont. I asked him to pray for Vermont, and he told me that he would. Overall, I left Rome with so many new friends, experiences, and a deeper connection to Jesus and his Church.
