# A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

In last Sunday's homily, Fr. Pat urged us to be "men and women of prayer" and to explore different ways to "deepen our prayer life." The saint for Monday August 4 is a perfect teacher for that: Saint John Vianney, Priest (1786-1859). He lived during the chaotic period in the aftermath of the French Revolution. John Vianney was a dynamic and humble parish priest despite his desire for solitude. He tried running away four times (!) to the monastery yet came back to continuing serving his flock.

The selection from St. John Vianney in the Office of Readings is a beautiful reflection on "The glorious duty of man: to pray and to love." In it, he makes a very simple presentation on the depth of prayer. Prayer is not primarily asking for things, but entering into "union with God." The images St. John Vianney uses are found in our windows. See if you can find them and meditate on how they can help your prayer life deepen:

"Our prayer is incense that gives him the greatest pleasure."

"My little children, your hearts are small, but prayer stretches them and makes them capable of loving God."

"Prayer is nothing else but union with God. When one has a heart that is pure and united with God, he is given a kind of serenity and sweetness that makes him ecstatic, a light that surrounds him with marvelous brightness. In this intimate union, God and the soul are fused together like **two bits of wax** that no one can ever pull apart.... Prayer never leaves us without sweetness. It is **honey** that flows into the soul and makes all things sweet."

"Some men immerse themselves as deeply in **prayer as fish in water**, because they give themselves totally to God. There is not division in their hearts. O, how I love these noble souls! Saint Francis of Assisi and Saint Colette used to see our Lord and talk to him just as we talk to one another."

St. John Vianney is the patron of parish priests, so let us use his feast day to pray for Fr. Pat and Fr. Luan.
