Let us pray that societies where coexistence seems more difficult might not succumb to the temptation of confrontation for ethnic political, religious, or ideological reasons.

Art That Looks at You

I was listening to a lecture by an Italian theologian that teaches in Rome (Dr. Thomas Cattoi, Angelicum) and he said something I had never heard before. To paraphrase, he said that starting with the Renaissance, artists started making art that you look at. Before that, artists made art that looks at you. To put it another way, the very realistic art to represent the world with greater precision. Pre-Renaissance art was designed to be a gateway into the spiritual realm.

Not only gateways, but ones that Christ and the saints draw us in. Pope Benedict explains this dynamic in his book *The Spirit of the Liturgy*: images draw us into a "path of hope," "giving us the assurance of the world to come, of the final coming of Christ".

This certainly describes the windows of St. Augustine Church active presence of Jesus and the saints through them. Even when the eyes of the person in the image is not looking directly at us, they are through the light of the sun.

So the next time you look at the windows, remind yourself that they have been looking back at you the whole time, calling you into God.




A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows
