Pope's Monthly Prayer Intention

September

For Our Relationship with All of Creation

Let us pray that, inspired by Saint Francis, we might experience our interdependence with all creatures who are loved by God and worthy of love and respect.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Many of us have heard of the practice of **Lectio Divina**, or "divine reading." It's a way of praying with a passage from the Bible by reading slowly and contemplating the meaning for an extended period of time. It's based on Jewish practice and was first introduced by St. Gregory of Nyssa (c 330-395) and further encouraged by St. Benedict of Nursia (c 480-547). One way is to read the passage four times over a 30 minute period. Each reading has a different focus; Lectio (a straight forward reading), Meditatio (reflection on the deeper meaning), Oratio (discerning how you are called to respond), Contemplatio (listening to what God might be saying).

Visio Divina is a way of using this approach with images such as our windows. Like with a reading, you sit prayerfully with the image for an extended period of time and in the four ways described above. You ask God to reveal unseen detail and truth. You pray to more closely conform yourself to the image. Through this practice, the image stays with you long after you are done praying. Here's one short guide:

There are many ways to do this, but one way to start is to incorporate the images on the windows into the Rosary, contemplating the image for each mystery. I've included the images for joyful mysteries.

Or do a "St. Augustine Church Window Rosary:" say a Hail Mary before each of the 28 images from the Life of Christ.













Knights of Columbus Raffle
