Mass Times Update

After being in Vermont for over 8 years, Fr Luan will be returning to Vietnam to visit his family. Because of the long travel times our priests from other countries take extended vacations when they go home. Fr. Luan will be away from May 4 to July 1. Since Fr. Pat will be alone during that time, Bishop McDermott has granted permission for the parish mass schedule for St. Augustine and St. Monica to be reduced starting the weekend of May 9-10.

The new mass schedule will be:

Saturday at 4:15pm at St. Monica
Sunday at 9:00am at St. Augustine
Sunday at 11:00am at St. Monica
Sunday at 4:15pm at St. Monica

Confessions will be heard:

Saturday at 3:00 to 3:45pm at St. Monica
Sunday at 8:15 to 8:45am at St. Augustine
Sunday 3:15 to 3:45pm at St. Monica

Since there are extra masses due to funerals, graduations, TV Masses, Totus Tuus, Catholic Daughters events and other things, Fr. Pat has to also consider changing the daily mass schedule while Fr. Luan is away. **Parishioners will need to check the bulletin each week for daily mass times.** Once Fr. Luan returns, 2 daily masses should be possible.

Due to the lesser number of masses, Fr. Pat is making the following policies so that more masses will be available for parishioners' intentions:

Pro Populo Masses: Each weekend only 1 mass will be offered for the intention of parishioners. This is an obligation every pastor has. Since Fr. Pat is pastor of both parishes, only 1 Mass will be celebrated in either parish, fulfilling the obligation.

All Souls Masses: The offerings given on November 2, for the All Souls Intentions are used for every Mass on November 2, 1 mass per week in November, and 1 mass per month for December on. These All Souls Masses will be offered for those intentions from both St. Augustine and St. Monica Parishes.

We still have permission for 1 collective Mass per weekend, with up to 3 intentions allowed.

Because of the limited number of mass intentions spaces, and the wonderful tradition in our community of having masses offered, the office staff will limit the number of masses for a particular person or intention when necessary and spread them over a period of time.

As the number of priests in the Diocese continues to shrink, and getting a priest to fill in becomes impossible, these changes are necessary. Fr. Pat believes these changes will work even after St. Monica/St. Augustine are assigned only 1 priest. Therefore, when Fr. Luan returns from Vietnam, these policies will remain in effect.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

Merry Christmas! Sunday January 11 is the Baptism of

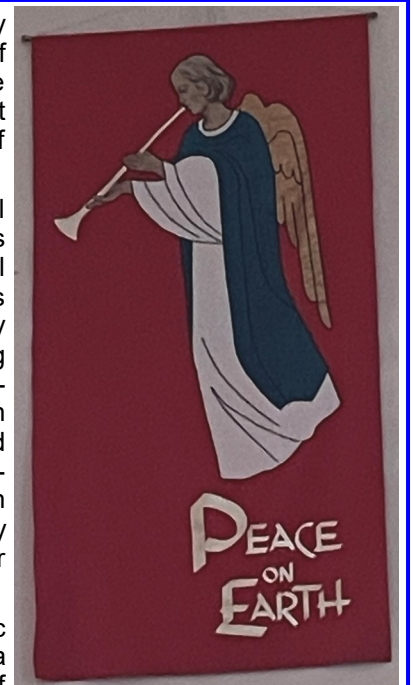
the Lord and the last day of the Christmas Season. It is also the last time we will see these red angel banners until next December. I didn't know anything about them until Fr. Pat shared their history with me this year. It turns out they carry with them a powerful legacy of female leadership and prayer.

The banners were made by the Discalced Carmelite Nuns that once lived on Beckley Hill Road in Barre. The nuns moved from Williston to the former sanitarium for granite workers in Barre in 1968 and were there until 1997 (now home to Washington County Mental Health). They earned their living by making liturgical vestments and decorations such as the angel banners at St. Augustine Church. In 1997 they moved to Beacon Hill, NY to consolidate a few shrinking communities. A small group were able to return to Vermont in the 2000s and establish Carmel of St. Joseph Monastery in Lowell. A generous benefactor allowed them to build their chapel in 2012. They have experienced a renewal in the last few years, which you can read about in the Winter Issue of *Vermont Catholic*. They continue to support their life of deep contemplative prayer through Maryweave Vestments and painting icons.

The Discalced Carmelites are unique. The famous mystic St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582) founded the order as a reform of the Carmelites to bring them back to a life of radical simplicity and prayer ("discalced" meaning without shoes). There are both nuns and friars in the Discalced Carmelites, making Teresa the only woman to found an order with men in it. Fellow mystic St. John of the Cross (1542-1591), was Teresa's protégée. In 1970, Pope Paul VI proclaimed her the first female Doctor of the Church.

So when you see our red angel banners, pray for St. Teresa of Avila's intercession to help our ongoing reform of the St. Augustine Community, that we too may learn to live "without shoes."

Catechetical Corner: The Baptism of Our Lord

Why was Jesus baptized since he never sinned and was always in perfect union with God? Even John the Baptist seemed confused about this (see Matthew 3:14).

-It is BECAUSE Jesus was baptized that each of our baptisms have any meaning! By accepting Baptism, Jesus made the sacrament "efficacious". That means that it only has any power because Jesus chose to have it done to Himself!

-Jesus says that, by allowing Himself to be baptized, He was "fulfilling all righteousness" (see Matthew 3:15). In other words, those same waters that poured over the fully-Divine, perfectly-human Jesus are now what pour over each person who is baptized in His name. Everyone who is baptized can then become sharers in His Divine cleansing! In baptism, we are taking a holy bath with Jesus!

-That's why St. Peter, our first Pope, said, baptism "is not a removal of dirt from the body but an appeal to God for a clear conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."

-St. Paul also says that, in baptism, Jesus made the Church "holy, cleansing her by the washing with water through the word... to present her to himself as a radiant Church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless." (see Eph 5:26-27)

So, today's Feast Day is a great time for all of us to celebrate our own baptisms! Even if we were too young to remember what that moment was like, know that God remembers it and rejoices over it just as much as the day that Jesus Himself was baptized!

ATTENTION ALL CONFIRMATION STUDENTS

All our young people who are preparing for Confirmation this April are expected to attend the Diocese of Burlington Confirmation Pilgrimage on Saturday, January 17, 2026 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. This is a self-transport event, so parents will need to arrange arrival and departure from the Cathedral at 29 Allen St., Burlington VT. The event goes from 10am through the Cathedral's Vigil Mass, which usually ends at 5pm: please be punctual. The parish will cover the cost of all student participants, but if parents wish to come and stay for the retreat they will need to pay a \$15 cover charge for food and materials.
