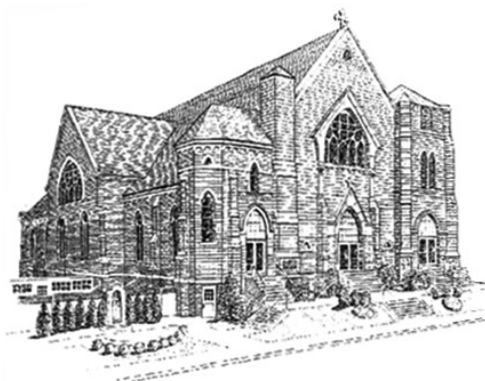

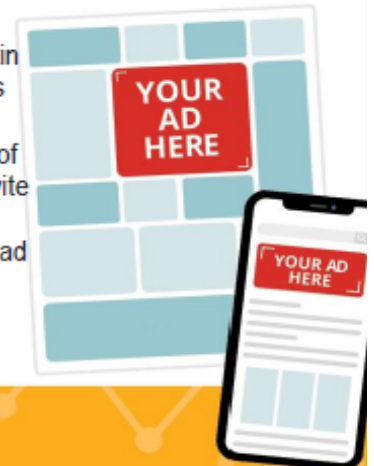

Mass Times Update Reminder

After being in Vermont for over 8 years, Fr Luan will be returning to Vietnam to visit his family. Because of the long travel times our priests from other countries take extended vacations when they go home. Fr. Luan will be away from May 4 to July 1. Since Fr. Pat will be alone during that time, Bishop McDermott has granted permission for the parish mass schedule for St. Augustine and St. Monica to be reduced starting the weekend of May 9-10.

A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

In the Gospel reading on Wednesdays January 21, Jesus enters a synagogue and heals a man with a withered hand (Mark 3:1-6). This is a perfect time to look at the Father's Hand window in the top left of the sanctuary. A hand is an important Jewish way of portraying God's action in art as Jewish tradition does not allow the depiction of God as a person.



A great example of God's Hand in Jewish art is in a fresco found in the Dura-Europos synagogue in Syria, dated about 244. Moses leads the Israelites across the Red Sea with the Egyptian troops in pursuit. Above, God's hands are stretched out, evoking Deuteronomy 11:2-3: "his strong hand and outstretched arm; the signs and deeds he wrought in the midst of Egypt, on Pharaoh, king of Egypt, and on all his land."
