

Let us pray that praying with the Word of God be nourishment for our lives and a source of hope in our communities, helping us to build a more fraternal and missionary Church.


A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows

This week we look at a symbol that is found in the front right of the church. I had known that this was a Marian symbol but its exact meaning had been a mystery to me. My friend, Dr. Eric Buck, who taught at Magdalen College in New Hampshire, helped unpack its meaning. This is a monogram, or a symbol made by two or more overlapping letters meant to distill the essence of a person and their power into a direct, artistically compelling form.

This monogram is made with the letters "M" and "R," representing *Maria Regina*, or Queen Mary, which in turn is highlighted by the gold crown on top. Eric saw two artistic embellishments that added important meaning. First, the shape of the "M" evokes the "fleur-de-lis, the lily, a Christian symbol of piety and purity and innocence." Second, in the strong base at the bottom of the "M" Eric sees "qualities of the candelabra (a candle holder with multiple arms), suggesting that Mary is the Bearer of the Light of the world."



Eric's explanation of the monogram further illuminates the Alpha/Omega symbol that we examined in our August 27 bulletin. This also functions as a kind of monogram of Christ, combining the Alpha and Omega (the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet, what Jesus is called three times in the Book of Revelation: 1:8, 21:6, 22:13) with a cross.



Finally, the two monograms are symmetrically placed in the windows. Mary's monogram is the middle right symbol in the front right window. Christ's monogram is the middle left symbol in the back right window. I believe that this is another example of the often-unnoticed layers of meaning that Burnham incorporates to tie the windows into a single artistic piece.
