

### **ATTENTION ALL CONFIRMATION STUDENTS**

All our young people who are preparing for Confirmation this April are expected to attend the Diocese of Burlington Confirmation Pilgrimage on Saturday, January 17, 2026 at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. This is a self-transport event, so parents will need to arrange arrival and departure from the Cathedral at 29 Allen St., Burlington VT. The event goes from 10am through the Cathedrals Vigil Mass, which usually ends at 5pm: please be punctual. The parish will cover the cost of all student participants, but if parents wish to come and stay for the retreat they will need to pay a \$15 cover charge for food and materials.

## For Christians in areas of conflict

Let us pray that Christians living in areas of war or conflict, especially in the Middle East, might be seeds of peace, reconciliation, and hope.

## *A Window into Our Stained Glass Windows*

A few weeks ago, Fr. Pat shared this framed collage of seven images taken from the stained glass windows of St. Augustine Church: three Christmas scenes, the angels in the choir loft, St. Augustine's face, the pierced heart below him, and Christ the King in the northern transept. On the back it says "Father Searles, from Alice LeMay, Easter 1993...Picture done by Fr. Maurice Roy."

Many parishioners remember Fr. Wendell Searles (1929-2018) as he was pastor of St. Augustine church 1984-1995. Last Christmas (12/22/24) we looked at his love of image of the Nativity and its four-posted bed, so much so that he made holy cards with the image. We saw that the bed probably alludes to a common image in Scripture: the pillars of the earth. This is seen in Hannah's canticle, which is a source for Mary's Magnificat: "For the pillars of the earth are the LORD's, and he has set the world upon them" (1 Sam 2:8).



I don't know much about the origin of the collage (let me know if you do) but we have a couple clues. Fr. Pat said Fr. Searles was famous for his simplicity. "He always said that he could move in a heartbeat, that everything he owned fit in the trunk of his car." That's probably one reason why he left it behind. The other reason may be related to when it was made, Easter 1993. This means that the collage was not a going away present, as he didn't leave St. Augustine Church until 1995. Perhaps he thought it was more a gift to the rectory than to him.

So in a certain sense, maybe this is a gift from Fr. Searles to us. That in the 30th anniversary of his departure, this was discovered as a sign of his ongoing prayer for us and the renewal of St. Augustine Church.
