AUGUST 30: ST. ROSE OF LIMA



Rose was named Isabel when she was born, but she was such a beautiful baby that her parents called her Rose and that nickname is what everyone called her for her whole life. As she grew up she became more and more beautiful and everyone noticed what a beautiful woman she was. Her mother liked to put wreaths of roses in her hair in order to show off how beautiful Rose was. This worried Rose, because she loved Jesus so much and she didn't want people to notice her, she wanted them to pay attention to Jesus. So she would hide thorns in the roses of her crown to remind her of Jesus' crown of thorns and one day she rubbed pepper on her face until it became red and blistered so that people would not stare at her beauty anymore. Her parents wanted her to get married, but she wanted to live her life for Jesus. She committed herself to Jesus as a Third Order of St. Dominic, which means she lived her life devoted to God in her home. She spent her life praying for people to know Jesus and for her Bishop (who later became a Saint too) and also helped those who were sick and needed help. People say that she loved God so much that her face glowed and her eyes sparkled with His love. She suffered a lot in her life, with illness and sadness at the sin in the world. But even in her suffering God blessed her with deep faith and sometimes even gave her visions; once God spoke to her, "Rose of My Heart, be My spouse". Rose died very young, she was only 31 years old.

DISCIPLESHIP IS NOT AN EASY PATH

As you know, discipleship is not an easy path. Sometimes we are called to have difficult conversations with one another. In the passage from Ezekiel, we find God instructing the prophet to speak out against his brother's wicked behavior. We see a similar message in today's reading from Matthew. We are to settle disputes and help usher the Kingdom into our world, yet our culture tells us to mind our own business...to focus on the plank in our own eye. What are we to do?? Paul points us in the right direction when he says, "Love does no evil...love is the fulfillment of the law." We are to admonish one another in love, AND we are to receive one another in love. Indifference is not loving. Condemnation is not loving. Defensiveness is not loving. If we truly love our neighbor as we love ourselves, we will make sacrifices to save them from death, and we would want them to do the same in return. Pray for courage, grace, and humility, lest your hearts become hardened!
