

ADVENT: A SEASON OF JOYFUL PENITENCE

It may sound like a *non-sequitur* to describe the season of Advent as one of "joyful penitence". However, few things bring more joy to the human soul than living in the Grace of forgiveness, be it human or divine. So, in Advent we give a little more emphasis to the Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass, moving from "Form B" (Have mercy on us, O Lord...) to "Form A" (the *Confiteor*, "I confess...") In addition, we will chant the *Kyrie*, while omitting the *Gloria*. In this season we return to the use of Latin for the Sanctus and the Agnus Dei, reflecting the words of "Sacrosanctum Concilium": "The use of the Latin Language is to be preserved in the Latin rites." and "Gregorian Chant should be given pride of place" (Both from The Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy of the Documents of the Second Vatican Council: "Musicam Sacram") In these days of constant, rapid change it becomes more and more important for us to conserve the traditions of our Catholic Faith, especially when secular traditions threaten to overrun and re-define the Christmas season. This will be a beautiful season of Grace and Renewal. Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus.

THE FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS AT THE SHRINE OF OUR LADY OF LA SALETTE, ENFIELD, NH

This year the "Festival of Lights" starts Thanksgiving evening and will continue until January 2, 2023. We will turn the lights on nightly from 5pm until 9pm. Because of covid19, we will not be open Monday or Tuesday evenings. We will be providing a reduced food selection in the cafeteria to help keep everybody safe and socially distanced from each other.

The theme of our "Festival of Lights" this year is "Mary Uniting all Cultures". Once again, we are offering our heartwarming panorama of Christmas light displays and the wonderful display of nativity scenes from all over the world. We will celebrate the Holy Mass each evening at 6 pm so we can be nourished with sacred scripture, the Sacraments-Christ present in the Eucharist- and be with a supportive community of believers.

FEAST OF THE IMMACULATE CONCEPTION THURSDAY, DECEMBER 8

Thursday, December 8 is the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a Holy Day of Obligation. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception holds that the most Blessed Virgin Mary, in the first instance of her conception, by a singular grace and privilege granted by Almighty God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved free from all stain of original sin. Our Blessed Mother in her title "The Immaculate Conception" is patroness of both the United States and the Diocese of Burlington. Masses on this feast day will be at 9am and at 6pm.

ANNUAL "MESSIAH SING"

On Sunday, December 11, at 4PM, Our Lady of the Snows will host the annual Messiah Sing, our parish's contribution to Wassail Weekend. There will be a professional orchestra and soloists; but anyone who wishes to sing may join the Chorus. Just bring a libretto. The event is open to the public, and is a truly enjoyable Advent tradition.
