

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT March 7, 2021

Dear brothers and sisters,

The current phenomenon of turning logic or science on its head is not new. Plenty of times in history men have come into power who have coerced whole populations to believe what is false or at least to act like they believed what the powerful were demanding.

In the days of Rome, if you were unwilling to offer incense to the pagan gods, then you were fined, tortured or killed. Many offered incense who did not believe at all, but wanted to save their life breath or their skin or their property. The Old testament tells of many such occasions, for example, the mother of seven sons in the Book of Maccabees who urged her sons in their native language to defy the pagan king's orders to eat pork in violation of the Law of Moses. All seven were tortured and died in fidelity.

In the past few days, the House of Representatives, a body of men and women who are supposed to be the wise and trusted leaders of our government, have passed a bill called the "Equality Act". Let us pray that the Senate does not concur with the wickedness of those who would cooperate with such a diabolical effort to corrupt our society.

This is what the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops have said about the bill:

*The Equality Act, which is being voted on in the U.S. House of Representatives soon, in many ways does the opposite and **needs to be opposed**. Instead of respecting differences in beliefs about marriage and sexuality, the Equality Act would discriminate against people of faith. The Equality Act would: punish faith-based organizations, such as charities and schools who serve everyone in their communities...[It would] force girls and women to compete against boys and men for limited opportunities in sports, and to share locker rooms and shower spaces with biological males who identify as women; risk mandating taxpayers to fund abortions; force people in everyday life, and especially health care workers, to support gender transition; and expand what the government considers a "public" place, forcing even some parish halls to host functions that conflict with Catholic beliefs.*

The seventh son to die rebuked the pagan king with these words, *"But you, wretch, most vile of mortals, do not, in your insolence, buoy yourself up with unfounded hopes, as you raise your hand against the children of heaven. You have not yet escaped the judgment of the almighty and all-seeing God."* (2 Macc 7:34-35) Those who would try to force god-fearing men to accept homosexual activity or transgenderism will stop at nothing to clothe their depravity with the protection of public law. Their fate is no less dire than that described by those brave sons of that noble woman.


Followed by Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament


2nd Collection: Catholic Relief Services, March 14
