Dear brothers and sisters,

To continue our reflection on our upcoming jubilee year 2022, let us listen to Pope St. John Paul II as he wrote about the jubilee 2000. "The words and deeds of Jesus... represent the fulfillment of the whole tradition of jubilees in the Old Testament. We know that the jubilee was a time dedicated in a special way to God." (Tertio Millennio Adveniente #12)

"It is Jesus who proclaims the good news to the poor. It is He who brings liberty to those deprived of it, who frees the oppressed and gives back sight to the blind (cf. Mt. 11:4-5; Lk. 7:22). In this way He ushers in "a year of the Lord's favor," which He proclaims not only with his words but above all by his actions." (TMA #11)

In last week's bulletin, we identified Jesus as the Anointed One who was to come and fulfill the promise that laid hidden in all the previous jubilees. And we observed that we too are anointed by the Spirit of the Lord and as such we become heralds of the jubilee, as St. John Paul II said, not only with our words, but above all by our actions.

We must begin our preparation now for the St. Michael 2022 Jubilee. This is so much more than an anniversary. We will not be focused on self-congratulations, rooting thru old photos and other nostalgic activities. Those heirlooms of the past are fun to drag out from time to time.



But the jubilee is an on-going work of the Spirit of the Lord who Himself is the object of our joy and recollection. The jubilee is a sort of memorial of what the Lord has done for us in Jesus Christ through the Holy Spirit and what He intends to do in our time and our parish.

This is a time of discernment of what the Lord is going to do through us in the upcoming jubilee year. How are you going to be used by God to announce the year of the Lord's favor? As instruments of grace in the Hands of God, we are privileged to be Catholics and members of His Body, the Church. And so they call us "Christians," those anointed to bring the gladness of knowing God who is always present and desires that all come to know Him.




Nursing Ministry Opportunity

Our Lady of Guadalupe Comes to St. Michael !

The Missionary Image of Our Lady of Guadalupe is coming to the Washington DC/Maryland area on the last 3 weeks of May. The event is called "The Triumph of Mary Tour". It will consist of a collection of visitation events at various parishes in the area and appearances at abortion sites.

Our parish will be visited on the evening of Wednesday, May 19. Here is an outline of the event:

- 6:00 PM – Image of Our Lady Arrives
- 7:00 PM - Gospel Reading and reflection by Fr. Martin Flum, followed by Benediction and Reposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
- 7:30 PM - Holy Rosary and Procession with Our Lady (*This will take the place of the usual Wednesday Eucharistic Procession*)

This Missionary Image was made from the original Miraculous Image produced by the Blessed Virgin Mary on the "tilma" of Saint Juan Diego. These full-size images (4' x 6') were blessed at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Mexico by the Rector of the Basilica. The mission of these images is to end abortion and to bring conversions. These missionary images have traveled all over the world to thousands of parishes and these travels are associated with outstanding and, at times, reportedly miraculous events. The following is a quotation from the "Visitation Manual" describing an example of a miraculous event:

In Wichita, Kansas, the Missionary Image visited an abortion center where late-term babies are killed and cremated in an incinerator on the premises. As the Image was processed around the center, people smelled a strong fragrance of roses. Then, they saw rose petals miraculously flaking from the Image in all directions. An eyewitness to this extraordinary event, experienced an overwhelming peace and said that it seemed as if heaven had come down to earth and Our Lady was saying, "It is good for you to be here; as I too stood at the foot of the Cross silently watching and praying as my innocent Son was crucified."
