The Readings at Church

In the readings this Sunday, there are two accounts of liturgical ceremonies that have significance for us today. The first reading shows the priest scribe Ezra who reads from a portion of the Old Testament. As Ezra reads the Scriptures, all the people listened attentively to the book being read. When Ezra blesses the Lord God, the people acclaim "Amen, Amen!" At a particular moment, the people bow down and prostrated themselves before the Lord. Many of us can probably relate this experience of liturgy of the Mass. We hear the readings proclaimed by the lector or the priest and listen attentively. We make the communal acclamation of praise, "Thanks be to God." We even at times guiet our inner selves in holy fear and worship when we hear a particularly meaningful passage. How similar we are to our brothers and sisters who worshiped so many ages ago!

In the Gospel, we observe Jesus reading in the synagogue from the Book of Isaiah. While reading, the eyes of all in the synagogue looked intently at him. He proclaims to them, "Today this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." Jesus has been sent to redeem us and set us in right relationship with God and with others. His words bring "liberty to captives" who are under Satan's yoke. His powerful hands "let the oppressed go free" from the slavery to sin and malice. Jesus is the answer to so many prayers and he comes to soothe the troubled heart. When we gather today at Mass, we rejoice that we are listening to Jesus' voice once again. Through God's powerful and living Word, we are set free from the snares of Satan and the domain of death. We hope that by listening to Christ's voice today we will be strengthened and be delivered from all dangers.

Our Lady of Guadalupe is Finally Up at St. Michael's for Our Veneration!

In case you missed this last time, read and learn about the miraculous image of 1531:

• Eyes - Contain images of the scene with Juan Diego and the bishop that are visible only with modern technology. In

the 1970s, a Japanese optician who was examining the eyes fainted. When he recovered, he said that "the eyes were alive and looking at him."

- **Hands** United in prayer, the left hand is darker than the right, representing both prominent races in Mexico at the time, European and indigenous.
- **Ribbon** A symbol of virginity. Additionally, its placement indicates that she is with child.
- **Flower** These patterns are glyphs of the native language, containing various intricate messages.
- **Temperature** the temperature of the Tilma is constant at 98.6 degrees, the same as that of a living body.
- Endurance The colors of the image are miraculously fresh and bright for being more than **500** years old. The fabric that the image appears on normally disintegrates in 15-30 years, yet the Tilma shows no sign of fading or cracking.
- **Resilience** The Tilma has survived a bomb attempt, and also miraculously reconstituted itself after nitric acid solvent was spilled on it.
- Stars The stars on Our Lady's mantle are accurate to the actual constellations that would have been in the Mexican sky on December 12, 1531, the day the miraculous image appeared.
- **Heartbeat** A stethoscope placed below the black band detected rhythmic beats of 115 per minute, the same as a baby's in the womb.
- **Origins** No sign of paint, brush strokes, or underdrawings have been found, the image is irreproducible; if attempted, the image disappears.
- Moon Our lady stands above (crushes) a snake-skinned moon, a symbol of an Aztec serpent god of human sacrifice.
