When you are flooded with consolations and feelings of peace and joy, it's easy to love God. When adoration is an occasion of rest and refreshment, the natural course of action is to come back for more.

But maybe prayer for you is just plain hard. Maybe Mass is a struggle and you leave feeling defeated. Maybe adoration feels like a big waste of time.

It's easy to become discouraged if your experience of adoration doesn't seem holy enough. Other people describe it as life-changing, meanwhile you're either stressed about a million other things that need to get done, or you can't make it through the first five minutes without falling asleep, or God remains silent, or you spend the entire hour managing the circus that is your children, or your ever-anxious mind won't stop telling you that you're doing it all wrong... and if you're anything like me, it's a little bit of all of that.

Jesus doesn't need you to say all the perfect prayers and feel all the devout feelings. He only wants you to be with Him. It doesn't matter whether you're overcome with pious emotion or you're just glad to have made it through the hour.

Love is more than a feeling; it is a choice. Whether you feel that love or not, continue to make the choice, over and over, to give yourself to Him. The greater your struggle, the greater is the gift you give. The saints in heaven are wildly cheering you on, rejoicing in your heroic determination.

As it says in today's gospel, "Lord, it is good that we are here." Keep showing up, keep fighting against the lies of Satan, keep giving your whole self to Jesus. He is there on the altar, waiting for you.



Fridays of the school year from 9-1 and are currently accepting new families. All ages are welcome, from newborn on up.


