Reflection by St. Michael's Parishioner, Amy Zager

"You're doing the bare minimum."

I will never forget these words or how they pierced in such a way, I heard very little of what followed. As though a bomb had stunned my hearing, all else was rather muffled. Intended as a consolation, it was the sentiment of a friend in response to the objections of those who disapproved of my faith and its hold on me: "How could anyone be upset? You're doing the bare minimum..."

"You shall: attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor, confess your sins at least once a year, receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season, observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church, help to provide for the needs of the Church."

These are the Precepts of the Church to which my friend alluded; what deem one a "Practicing Catholic." Eucharistic Adoration is not found among them. In fact, most of us will satisfy the requirements with relative convenience and ease. But what prompts the heart to give more, causing it to skip its rhythm? Or takes one's breath away only to return it again renewed? It's worth noting, the spiritual life is not intended to simply have a weakened pulse. He who longs for us to have life, ardently desires we should have it to the full!

"The bare minimum." I stood convicted. "There is no one else I love this way," I thought as my friend continued on. In fact, this isn't what a mature, deep, abiding love does at all! No... love surrenders all, lamenting when there is nothing more to give. But how can we love someone we do not truly know? Consider well, dear reader, the unparalleled opportunity that comes in the form of Adoration. How Our Lord must delight in the company of one who visits with Him simply because he/she wishes to draw near. While obedience can most certainly be an expression of love, oh what it fosters in the soul to aim higher! To live out both the generosity and intimacy inspired by the spousal relationship of Christ and His Church. To truly know Him, by whom we are so very well known.

In the days that followed, I failed to be able to name a saint who ever considered precepts "enough" for Him who gave His Precious Life for ours. Rather, they echo the expression of the Psalmist, "How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good He has done for me?" Let us do the same, giving all of our very selves, adopting the attitude of true lovers who find sweet contentment in one another's company.

He has said, "You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." "You shall... with all." You must. I must. Mustn't we?
