3rd Sunday of Advent

Gaudete Sunday: December 17th, 2023

Reflection by St. Michael's Parishioner, Sherry Fila

When I was first invited to go to Adoration, I went out of a sense of obligation to worship my Lord and Savior and to thank Him for the gift of Salvation. But I was reminded that God needs nothing from me. Rather it is I who need everything from Him. One day at Adoration, I was struggling with what I should do for the love of Jesus. I wanted to make a sacrifice, but in my human weakness, I didn't want to make too big of a sacrifice. Therein was the struggle: sacrifice or selfishness. In the middle of my Holy Hour, a clear thought surfaced: "My daughter, give Me anything you want and I will bless it." It was such a tender and paternal inspiration. Every week, I bring my worries, distractions, and brokenness to Adoration. When I leave, I still have those worries, distractions, and brokenness, but more importantly, I feel beloved by Jesus having rested in His tender gaze.

Every visit is an opportunity to reestablish my relationship with Jesus...to know and love Him more. One of my favorite spiritual exercises as I pray before the Blessed Sacrament is to imagine Jesus on Christmas night. I meditate on the Holy Family, the angels, the shepherds, the light and sounds, picturing myself in the middle of it all. In my imaginings, Mary silently places her Son in my arms to hold, a dramatic reminder that He was born for me. For us all! The precious and perfect Christmas gift. Then, with great intention, I try to transition my thoughts to Calvary and His equally precious death. Once again, I meditate on His mother, Mary Magdalene, St. John, the fierce soldiers and angry crowd. Likewise, in my thoughts, Mary gestures that He is dying to save me. Save us all! The perfect sacrifice for our eternal salvation. As I look at the golden monstrance and see Jesus concealed in mystery, these images help me to adore Him.

St. Faustina said: "A Holy Hour before the Most Blessed Sacrament so pleases the Heart of Jesus, that every man, woman and child on earth receives a new effect from God's goodness." I keep this in mind while I pray for my family, our parish, our Church and the world. When I become overwhelmed with worries about the state of the world, this quote renews my hope and trust in Jesus' promises.

Lastly, I have the special opportunity to attend weekly Holy Hour with the children on Mondays from 11:00 to 12:00 and regular Holy Hour on Wednesdays. As you might imagine, there are some big differences. The youngest children often run up the main aisle to see Jesus surrounded by the golden magnificence of the monstrance. Although we try to remind the children to be quiet and reverent, I sincerely believe that Jesus is most pleased by their eagerness and chatter. After all, that is how God created them, with extra energy, spirit, and wonder. He wants to love them, just as He wants to love you. You don't have to run up the aisle, but come to Adoration and let yourself be loved.
