

The Seventh Sunday of Easter The Ascension of Our Lord

This weekend is our liturgical celebration of the Ascension of our Lord, when Jesus was taken to heaven on the fortieth day after Easter. The Gospel is from the conclusion of the Gospel of Luke where Jesus assigns His disciples the task of proclaiming the word of God to the entire world.

As in the Acts of the Apostles, in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus' instruction is to await "the promise of the Father about which you have heard me speak; for John baptized with water, but in a few days, you will be baptized with the Holy Spirit."

Before His ascension, Jesus directs the disciples to return to Jerusalem to await the fulfillment of His promise to send them the Holy Spirit, the Helper, a manifestation of His enduring presence among them and us too, until the end of time. "Stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high," Jesus instructed them. That they who believe in Jesus will be empowered to do what Jesus Himself has done.

God speaks to us in many ways, including through the Sunday Scripture readings. As always, our Sunday gatherings are an invitation to enter into the sacred history of which we, as church, are a part. Perhaps as we contemplate this feast, we can place ourselves in the unfolding story. Let us imagine ourselves placed within the 40 days following the Resurrection, where Jesus presented Himself alive by many proofs after He had suffered, speaking about the kingdom of God.

In His final moments with His beloved disciples, Jesus reveals once more the depth of His love, as He lay bare his promise to remain with them always. Also imagine your experience of those last moments with the One whose love was greater than you ever dreamed. Immersed in the reality of His departure, receiving His blessing, and the sight of Him being taken up to heaven, would your experience be one of unspeakable awe? Would your heart be broken open from the immeasurable love that you have received, with a desire to return it? And in that moment, might there even be unbearable grief for the departure of a love you came to know beyond your imaginings?

Perhaps the greatest opportunity of this feast is to place ourselves in the unfurling story of the Gospel. That we come to embody the homage the disciples demonstrated before the Lord. And that through acts of love and compassion in our lives, and in the world, we become an offering of praise and gratitude. And that we remember, as Jesus promised to accompany His disciples, so too, He remains with us as we strive to live the Gospel. May it be so.
