

Pastor Speaks



As I celebrate this fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time with you, I convey greetings from abroad, Ghana. I'm grateful to the Lord and to all of you for sending lots of prayers our way to assist in the healing and recovery of my mother and my safety in air and road travels.

Faith Formation by Linda Hansmeier

At our last RCIA meeting on January 19, David Klostermann led us to a deeper understanding of baptism, especially the baptism of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ and what that means for each of us. If you follow the liturgical calendar, you know that the Feast of Baptism of the Lord indicated the end of the Christmas season and we immediately celebrated the Baptism of the Lord which is most significant for two reasons: 1) it marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry, and 2) and confirms his identity as the Son of God.

It was during his baptism that all three Persons of the Trinity were present at the same time: the Son being baptized, the Holy Spirit descended, and God the Father spoke from the heavens. God and the Holy Spirit confirm the deity of Christ, and Jesus submits to his Father's will.

When Jesus comes to John and tells him to baptize him John is confused as his is a baptism of repentance, and Jesus has nothing he needs to repent. Yet, Jesus is insisting that John baptizes him. Matthew's account in chapter 3: 13-15 explains it by telling us that by choosing to be baptized, Jesus fulfills all righteousness, preparing himself to be a perfect sacrifice for us.

For each of us, our baptism means we became adopted children of the Father, members of the Church, the Body of Christ, and temples of the Holy Spirit. Baptism washes away our original sin and claims us for the kingdom of God. We are filled with God's sanctifying grace and the fullness of the Trinitarian life, enabling us to understand the meaning and implications of our baptism as a means to grasp our identity, vocation and mission as disciples of Christ. Next Thursday the RCIA topic is the Eucharist. Everyone is welcome to join us at 6:00 p.m. in the ed wing.
