

Pastor Speaks

Staying Close to the Lord

This weekend marks the celebration of our parish feast in honor of St. John the Baptist. The feast of the nativity of St. John the Baptist is traditionally scheduled on the universal church calendar for June 24. However, as a parish church, with St. John as our patron, we mark the feast on the weekend to enable as many parishioners as possible to join in reflecting on his life and ministry and also pray for his powerful intercession.

The readings for this weekend urge us to stay close to God and put our trust in His providential care. Jesus said in the gospel, "Everyone who acknowledges me before others will acknowledge before my heavenly Father. But whoever denies me before others, I will deny before my heavenly Father."

St. John the Baptist was one person that acknowledged Jesus throughout his ministry and lifetime. And he challenged us also to acknowledge the Lord by *bearing* fruits worthy as the followers of the Lord (Luke 3:8).

One way to measure how closely we're really following Jesus is to take an honest look at our lives. Taking a look at our lives sometimes could mean asking another person to give you feedback about how you are doing. If you are a father, you could ask your wife or children, "How am I doing?" Mothers and children can do likewise.

We recall in another place where Jesus said, "A good tree can't produce bad fruit, and a bad tree can't produce good fruit. A tree is identified by its fruit". He's referring to people, not trees.

Most of the time, the people close to us know us best; we can rely on them to make changes in our lives by finding out from them with simple, open questions. For they see our "good fruits" such as love, joy, peace, patience, honesty, kindness, goodness, justice, gentleness, faithfulness, and self-control." But they also can identify our "bad fruits" such as anger, impatience, biases, unforgiveness, and lack of self control, selfishness, pride, greed, envy, gossip, unkindness, and hatred.

As we follow Jesus and grow closer to Him, His Spirit living in us will help us produce more and more good fruits, and less and less bad fruits. The changes in thoughts, attitudes, and actions will continue for a person's whole life because God is never done teaching us, shaping us, encouraging us, and transforming us into the people He created us to be. Let's stay close to Jesus.

Jesus did not need to be baptized because he was totally faithful to the will of his Father and free from sin. However, he wanted to show his solidarity with human beings in order to reconcile them to the Father. By commanding his disciples to baptize all nations, he established the means by which people would die to sin – Original and actual – and begin to live a new life with God.

In Baptism, the Holy Spirit moves us to answer Christ's call to holiness. In Baptism, we are asked to walk by the light of Christ and to trust in his wisdom. We are invited to submit our hearts to Christ with ever deeper love.
