

Pastor Speaks

Welcoming the fall season with fresh starts

Nature has a way of teaching us about planning, waiting, experiencing, finishing, and letting go. The seasons of our climate bear witness to these apparent processes in life.

The summer season is almost gone and the start of fall is coming up fast. Ironically, fall is a paradoxical period. We will be admiring the tree leaves changing colors. Call it a busy time for the trees as well busy time for us. But we will all get busy as school and work activities get underway.

Families are already beginning to see those in college off with some difficulties, as parting is always painful to some extent, especially for those leaving home for the first time. The non-college children are not only getting ready as well to go back to school but for now, their presence in the house will provide consolation for the family. Families will start working more than they had done in the summer months and engage in several family—related events and activities.

As we prepare to step into the busyness of life, is there a place for faith experiences? Are you making plans to include faith practices in your your personal and family schedule? If your family can consider doing so, that would be great!

There is no denying that more often, as life throws more at us, things we do for faith tend to get lost in our schedules and daily activities. It is not because we don't care about our faith but in our effort to meet all the obligations that seem to come with consequences, we trade off faith-related activities.

I have a suggestion for families as we move into the busyness of the fall and the other seasons. Not long ago, I shared with a senior priest how hard it was to keep a regular evening prayer time. Families, please schedule faith-related activities as you plan— for Mass, adoration, faith formation, the sacraments, and others. It's easier to do it when it is on the schedule. It assists in planning, waiting, experiencing, and finishing your prayers, being at Mass, reading, or listening to the Bible. Indeed, it makes faith become a priority and fulfillment for us.

Faith Formation classes will begin on Wednesday, September 20 for grades 5-8 from 6:00 p.m. until 7:15 p.m. and high school from 7:00 p.m. until 8:30 p.m. and on September 24 for grades K-4 from 9:00 a.m. until 10:15 p.m. Please join us every first and third Wednesdays from 7:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. for Adoration.

Beginning September 24 during Mass, Fr. Andrew will invite preschool aged children between 4 & 5 years old to come forward and be dismissed for Sunday Liturgy of the Word. The children will return to their family following the homily.

The last Sunday of the month will be Children's Mass. This year, each Children's Mass will have children and youth from a specific grade with high school students as their mentors.

Our first Parent meeting for sacramental preparation will be held on September 24 following Mass. Parents and family will meet in the lower level for family brunch. After brunch the 2nd grade children will return to their classroom with their catechists and their siblings will go to childcare in room 102. The parents will remain in the lower level for a meeting.
