

# Pastor Speaks The Gospel of Sacred Silence

In our Catholic tradition and culture, the sense of the SA-CRED is highly stressed and embedded in our practices and devotions. We hear of sacred music, sacred vestments, sacred vessels, sacred images, the Sacred Heart of Jesus and Mary, and the list goes on.

Thanks to our families and the church, the awareness and appreciation of the SACRED is inculcated in us right from our infancy through baptism to form a salient part of our lives and faith journey. As the church and our families introduce us to God, we become consciously aware of the sacred presence in our lives and our surroundings.

One tangible way we express this sense of the sacred is by observing Sacred Silence in the presence of God in prayer, devotion, or meditation. Thus, I reiterate my earlier appeal to you that as Catholics we observe silence once we are inside the Church. We need to create a prayerful ambiance that is fitting for the sacred place we all cherish and gather to encounter our God. Such Sacred Silence in the worship space is expected before, during, and after Mass because of the presence of the Blessed Sacrament and personal prayers.

Please look at the following expert advice, an excerpt from a 2004 Zenit article published in Rome. Here, Father Edward McNamara, professor of liturgy at the Regina Apostolorum Pontifical Athenaeum, addresses the issue of silence in the church in response to a question he received.

Q: What is the role of silence in a Mass? When should there be silence? — J.C., Perth, Australia

A: "Silence has a very important role to play in the celebration as indicated by the General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM), No. 45. 'Sacred silence also, as part of the celebration, is to be observed at the designated times,' the GIRM says. Its purpose, however, depends on the time in each part of the celebration. Thus, within the Act of Penitence and again after the invitation to pray, all recollect themselves; but after a reading or the homily, all meditate briefly on what they have heard; then after Communion, they praise and pray to God in their hearts. Even before the celebration itself, it is commendable that silence [to] be observed in the church, in the sacristy, in the vesting room, and adjacent areas, so that all may dispose themselves to carry out the sacred action devoutly and fittingly. To this, we would add that silence should also be observed after Mass until one is outside the Church building, both for respect toward the Blessed Sacrament and toward those members of the faithful who wish to prolong their thanksgiving after Mass. The specific periods of silence recommended in the GIRM encourage a general atmosphere of interior and exterior silence for all the participants at Mass."

However, I should explain that for our churches that are designed with gathering areas outside the main church, the use of such space for community and conversation is well merited; it's OK! Thank you for your devotion to our rich Catholic faith and culture.
