

Why Forgiveness must be a Gift

Barely, a month ago, a man called his longtime friend and told him that their friendship is over. These people have been friends forever. The guy who made the phone call was part of the groom's men during his friend's wedding. The reason for the call could be considered something silly. He was asking the friend to do something that he knew he was not physically able to accomplish. Was this a sufficient cause for ending years of good friendship?

Last weekend at Mass I related Jesus' teachings about forgiveness to marriage/family, friendship, and church. Obviously, these share commonalities stemming from human interactions involved. Most people mean well in their relationships whether they pertain to the church, marriage/family, or friendship.

Yet the vulnerability that clothes all of us as humans can cause us to put some members of our circle of relationships off or hurt them. If we see and understand all our relationships with the eyes and mind of Jesus, we can prevent relationships from turning sour or getting lost or even restore broken ones. This can only happen if we consider forgiveness as a gift.

Here is another story recorded in the book, True Colors, by Jim Talley, and Terry Benner. Joe was taking an afternoon walk near a lake where he was fishing. He was bitten by a snake and soon discovered the snake that bit him slithered into some undergrowth.

While in pain, he thought to himself, "I must get to a hospital. But first, I'll find that blankety-blank snake and kill it!" He spent precious time seeking sheepishly for the snake until the snake's venom quickly moved through his body to his heart. By the time he decided to go back to his car and seek medical assistance he was unable to move; right beside his car he fell, and he was later pronounced dead.

Paramedics found that where the incident occurred was only five minutes away from his car, and the hospital was twenty minutes away. It's simply that, in his anger, he wanted revenge on the rattlesnake more than he cared about the seriousness of the rattlesnake bite.


What a tragic and avoidable ending to a precious, active life. Lack of forgiveness has left many relationships to end tragically like what we find in the two stories and in this week's gospel story of the man who refused to forgive despite having experienced the joy of being FOR-GIVEN himself.

Jesus is asking us not to "GET MAD," not to "GET EVEN" but to FORGIVE. In other words, Jesus wants us to forgive "not seven times but seventy-seven times."


